NEW YEAR, LOVE RESIGNS, VOLUNTEERS, BOARD BUSINESS, PEDERSON PROGRESS

The new year will bring some exciting and some unsettling changes. I will begin with the exciting changes. The Board completed its debate on upgrades to the community clubhouse and authorized **Patti Smith**, the Community Manager, to proceed with hiring a painting contractor for the inside of the clubhouse and ordering replacement carpeting for the activity room and the exercise room. In addition several Board members and **Patti** will have completed an inspection of the clubhouse on December 20 to recommend any additional replacements or upgrades that may be required.

The Board completed its discussion and approval of Bylaw changes at the Special Board meeting on December 12. All the changes must now be incorporated into the master document, and both our management company and our attorney will review the document. Therefore, it will still be a while before you see these changes and have the opportunity to vote on them.

It was with a great deal of sadness that the Board accepted the resignation of **Crawford Love** as a Director and Vice President effective at the close of business at the December 12 Board meeting. He has placed his home on the market and is looking at other homes in North Scottsdale. **Crawford** has played the lead role in negotiations with the Pederson Group on the commercial development on Lone Mountain as part of his responsibility on the Modification Committee. As your President, I had been providing back up on this project to ensure community-wide interests were represented. Since the majority of work has been completed and the Modification committee is not fully staffed, the Board voted to appoint me lead liaison on this project with back up assistance from **Crawford** while he remains a resident. On behalf of the entire community, I extend my warmest congratulations for all of his efforts on this time-consuming project, which would not have had such a positive outcome without his superior negotiating skills. **(continued on page 5)**

JANUARY IN THE GARDEN

As we move into winter, we are presented with a new set of gardening tasks as well as some opportunities. It's also the time of year when rainfall amounts and temperature are key factors to consider when caring for your trees and shrubs. This is when your trees will undergo change and you should think about harvesting your citrus.

Trees

If winter rains are abundant, established desert-adapted trees do not need supplemental watering this month. Otherwise, water once deeply during the month. For non-desert trees, water deeply once this month. Continue to water newly planted trees every two to three weeks depending on the temperatures. Watering mature trees now, even native trees, keeps them vigorous through the warm season to come. It is considered by some horticulturists to be the most important watering that trees will receive. Long slow soaks in the region around the tree are best while being sure that you water to a depth of at least three feet.

This month, do not prune frost-sensitive, evergreens, or leguminous trees like mesquite, ironwood, acacias and palo verdes.

Mesquites begin to lose their leaves this month as they fade to yellow or brown and begin to fall off which is normal leaf loss in these plants. While screwbean mesquite is completely deciduous each year, velvet mesquite lose their leaves gradually, often as the new leaves emerge.

Shrubs

Continue planting cold-hardy shrubs. Cold-hardy deciduous shrubs should be planted before they leaf out. Be prepared to protect tender shrubs like red bird of paradise and yellowbells. On cold nights, throw a sheet, blanket, or frost cloth over the plant to provide temporary protection. Water shrubs every three to four weeks depending on the temperatures but do not fertilize or prune this month. Wait to clear out any frost damage until all danger of frost is past.

Harvesting Citrus

The best place to keep most citrus is on the tree as long as possible. Citrus will grow sweeter on the tree even after ripening. Tangerines will not stay on the tree as long as other citrus.

Once you pick oranges store them in a sturdy open carton or box in as cool a place as possible. Citrus stored this way should keep for 10 days to three weeks. Lemons keep best in the refrigerator where they will remain fresh for about six weeks.

Citrus can be frozen in sections with the membrane removed and packed in its own juice. If you want to keep it for more than six months, add ½ teaspoon powdered ascorbic acid to each quart of juice used to cover the sections.

Orange, grapefruit or lemon juice can be frozen in glass containers to prevent "off flavors". Orange juice may separate after thawing because of enzyme action. There is no way to prevent the juices from separating but it does not affect the safety or flavor.

Cacti

If your saguaro or other cacti have a reddish color during the winter, it may simply be a response to the cool dry conditions of winter and nothing needs to be done.

Bougainvillea

If you would like to take some of those magnificent Bougainvillea flowers inside the house to enjoy, the trick is to immerse the bracts (floral part) in water for one hour before placing them in a vase

Pre-emergent Herbicides

As rainfall here occurs primarily in the winter and early spring months, it is appropriate to apply preemergent weed control to prevent germination. Water it in to a depth of one inch to activate it but do not cultivate the soil. Once these products are watered in, they are safe around pets and children. Preemergent herbicides will control grasses and broadleafs, making gardening easier. And remember, don't apply pre-emergent herbicides anywhere you will be growing plants from seed.

This brings me to my list of unsettling changes. In the December newsletter, I informed you about **Paul Broad's** resignation at the end of his term in April. We need volunteers to help maintain and enhance our beautiful community so I respectfully urge you to consider what role you can play in that - up to and including running for a Board position.

The Board does appreciate all past and current volunteers and will be acknowledging all volunteers at a brunch on January 15 in the clubhouse at 11 a.m. For a list of those volunteers who along with one guest of their choosing are invited to this volunteer-only brunch, please see page 7.

There are also a number of open committee positions that have been advertised for months. With the resignation of **Anna Ingram** from the Modifications Committee, that committee barely has a quorum to act on homeowner requests for changes to landscaping and modifications to the outside appearance of homes.

I offer congratulations to the Activities Committee headed by **Sheila Lavin** on the well-attended Neighborhood Network brunch on December 4 as well as the Dancing class proposed by **Marcia Lefkowitz**. Some of us turned out to show grace on the dance floor, and no one really stepped on anyone's left foot. **Lou Vigna** and **Audra Breslin** won a door prize of free dance lessons, which is like sending coals to Newcastle.

Save the date of February 11 for a special Valentine's celebration that will be a catered event, free to Bellasera residents.

Several issues previously raised by homeowners were finalized at the December 12 meeting. First, the pack rat issue raised by **Dot** and **Bob Messinger**: The Board determined based on communication from the City of Scottsdale, the Center of Disease Control, and talks with the State Office of Infectious Diseases that the Community Association could not disturb the NAOS and remove the pack rat nest as these rats do not cause hantavirus nor do they carry bubonic plague and are therefore not a public health issue.

The Board also resolved the ongoing issue of the clubhouse dumpster issue. Buildings and Grounds came back with a resolution to leave the dumpster padlocked, but the Board defeated that resolution to accommodate part-time residents who need to remove their garbage and are not here on trash days. The dumpster will no longer be padlocked so part-time residents can be accommodated. But we ask that if you see landscape crews leaving their clippings behind or other abuses of the clubhouse dumpster, please report this to either **Sheila Nazareth** or **Patti Smith**. I do thank **Paul Anetsberger** and Buildings and Grounds for all their efforts on this issue. And I hope this is the last time that I have to talk trash to you.

The Board also approved a new pool maintenance contract as well as the replacement of additional pool parts.

This is the latest news on the Pederson commercial development on Lone Mountain. All the feedback to the Board from the most impacted neighbors on the design and construction elements has been positive. Gary Pederson is working directly with those most impacted on landscaping elements that will provide additional screening to their properties.

The Board's next regular meeting will be January 30 and will include a review of items to be placed in the 2007 Reserve Budget.
