There are several things I need to inform you about so I'll get right to it.

<u>Back Gate Operation</u>. We continue to operate with a temporary card reader that does not have the power necessary to function properly all the time. We've had several complaints about it not working. Unfortunately, we will not have a new reader until sometime in November.

<u>Clubhouse Repairs</u>. The roof leak saga continues! After the last rain, another leak was found and has now been repaired. The fitness room ceiling will be redone as soon as our contractor and Board are convinced all leaks have been located and repaired. For those of you concerned about the cost of this project, everything after the first repair is covered under our warranty.

The Board concluded the tile work in the men's shower was unsatisfactory. The installing contractor, TPM, was terminated without compensation and the shower will be redone by another contractor.

<u>Audit</u>. The Board decided a formal, independent audit of the Association's financial records should be conducted. This will include a review and evaluation of the internal controls of the Association and its management company. The selection of an auditor will take place at the October 26 Board meeting.

In accordance with the Bylaws requirement, unaudited financial statements will be available for review by any member by October 31. The requirement that these statements include a "statement of changes in financial position..." will be met upon completion of the independent audit.

Wall and Home Painting. We received three bids for the common wall and mailbox painting-a selection will be made at the October 26 Board meeting. Work will begin in November.

In the next two weeks, we will conduct a second inspection of homes to determine which homes are still in need of painting. Our thanks to all residents who responded to our first inspection and either had their homes painted or advised us of their plans to schedule the work. We will be sending out another notice upon completion of our inspections. Please respond by scheduling your home painting or advising us of a future time period when you plan to have your house painted.

I want to welcome back our residents who have been away for the summer and any new residents to the community.

#### **NOVEMBER IN THE GARDEN**

#### **Shrubs**

<u>Planting</u>-In November you can continue to plant frost-hardy and native woody shrubs. Some suggestions are: <u>Apache Plume</u>, <u>Jojoba</u>, <u>Texas</u> Mountain Laurel, and Texas Ranger.

Transplanting-If you have shrubs that need to be relocated, transplant them from now through January. To do so, follow these steps.

- 1. Begin by digging the hole for the shrub. Make the hole wider than the root ball but just as deep. Do not add amendments or mulch, but scratch the sides and bottom of the hole to rough it up. Fill the hole with water and let it drain completely before planting.
- 2. Remove the shrub, taking it out with as much soil as you can. If conditions are dry or the soil is light and subject to falling away from the root ball, water the shrub deeply before lifting it. This will help keep as much soil as possible around the root zone.
- 3. Place in the new hole and check to be sure the shrub is no deeper that it was in the original hole. Fill in with the backfill, firming it gently to remove air pockets and secure the shrub. Build a basin around the shrub and mulch heavily. Water well, and keep well watered for the first two weeks after transplanting. After that, water them every week for a month, then every eight to ten days until they begin growing in the spring.

Do not prune any part of the transplanted shrub until it has begun to grow in the spring. And, if it is a spring blooming shrub, do not prune until the bloom period is over.

<u>General Care</u> -Most insect pests and diseases are inactive during the coldest part of the year but you should keep the areas around shrubs free of any diseased pruning, or fruit to prevent future problems. Also, do not prune or fertilize shrubs this month.

#### **Succulents**

Continue to plant cool-season succulents like <u>Aloes, Gasteria</u> and <u>Dudleya</u>. Native succulents can be planted this month, but be careful that they are not too over watered during the winter. Do not plant cold-tender succulents this month.

#### **Christmas Cactus**

This wonderful houseplant of Brazilian ancestry requires special care this time of year. Flower buds should start to show late this month and, once buds are set and are about ½ inch long, gradually move the plant into more light over a week or two. Plants grow best in a spot with bright, indirect light that is cool and away from drafts. Also, avoid hot spots like a fireplace, west facing window, heater vent, top of a television or refrigerator.

Sudden changes in temperature or light, or both, will cause the buds to fall off.

Water Christmas cactus when the surface of the soil is dry. Fertilize with a water soluble fertilizer, mixing a solution at 1/4th of what is recommended for houseplants. Apply fertilizer every two weeks while they are blooming.

#### **Spring Color & Vegetables**

<u>Bulbs</u>- If you desire some spring color from bulbs, now is the time to prepare them. Buy Dutch iris, hyacinth and long-stemmed varieties of daffodils and tulips. Chill their bulbs in the refrigerator for five to six weeks before planting.

<u>Vegetables</u>- If vegetables are on your garden list, this a good month to sow seeds or set out plants of asparagus, beets, broccoli, brussels sprouts, cabbage, carrots, cauliflower, celery, endive, garlic, kale, kohlrabi, leeks, lettuce, mustard, parsley, peas, radishes, spinach, Swiss chard, and turnips.
