There has been some progress and a few changes from the date of my last letter.

Back Gate: We finally received and installed our new equipment. The gate should operate correctly now. If you have any problems, please call the office and report them.

Clubhouse Repairs: Contracts for the on-going roof work and men's shower have been assigned. Both jobs should be completed before Christmas.

Wall Painting: The Board was advised that we can save approximately \$10,000 by having our landscape maintenance company work on clearing the areas around the walls as part of their regular program. They will not charge us any extra for this work but it will take until March to complete. We checked with the paint contractors and they confirmed that their bids were good until that time. Accordingly, the Board voted to delay the painting until March.

Home Painting: Several homeowners have inquired about paint contractors in this area. Minor CC&R Violations: Our Manager spends a considerable amount of time inspecting the community for violations of our rules. When she finds a problem, a letter is sent out reminding our residents to comply with the rules they agreed to when they purchased in the community. The more common violations include: (1) parking cars on the streets over night, (2) leaving trash receptacles out beyond trash pickup day, (3) overgrown plant material in yards and (4) not having front yard landscape lights on at night. We've had some residents complain that we were being too "picky" about the rules and others complain that we weren't being diligent enough in enforcing them. 

DECEMBER IN THE GARDEN

In December, you need to pay attention to the weather as it has an influence on our garden activities such as planting and watering as well as pruning and fertilizing. You also need to pay special attention to nighttime temperatures as frost can occur this month.

Planting

You can plant cool-season trees, shrubs, vines, vegetables, annuals, perennials, and bulbs but *plan ahead*. Point-of-purchase decisions at the nursery are often fatal to the plants that you buy! Before you leave home, identify: (1) what you want from the plant (flowers, shade, fruit, wildlife attraction, etc.) and (2) what you have to offer (amount of sunlight, space for the mature plant and maintenance).

<u>Roses</u>- New rose catalogs come out and bare root roses are available at nurseries. When planting bare root roses, use a 2-foot by 2-foot hole that is well amended with organic matter.

Citrus

Continue to harvest citrus to test for sweetness. Small fruit size (especially oranges and grapefruit) may be noticed which may be a result of heavy fruit set or the weather. Lack of normal rainfall during the mid-summer period can also be an influence as growth is greater in response to rain versus a similar amount of irrigation.

Watering

For landscape plants, reduce watering to one deep irrigation monthly. Plants in containers may not need watering as frequently as they did a month or so ago. Check before watering to be sure the top inch of the soil is dry.

Miraculously, plants seem to know the difference between irrigation and rain. Even with steady, appropriate irrigation, fruit set and growth is always better with adequate rain.

Frost

Take precautions against freeze damage on tender annuals or newly planted ones. Plants that have been in the ground less than two weeks are much more susceptible to freeze damage than those with well-established root systems. Protect with any lightweight covering on a frosty night and remove it in the morning. Tents of newspaper work well as temporary frost protection. Secure with rocks, bricks or other heavy objects. Do not use newspaper if you expect rain with the cold, as the weight of the water makes it heavy and it can break the tender plants beneath it. Burlap also works well.

Miscellaneous

<u>Christmas Trees</u>- If you have a fresh Christmas tree this holiday season, the tree trunk should have a fresh cut to promote water uptake before being put into a tree stand. Check the level of water daily. <u>Aphids</u>- These garden pests can emerge during this month. Use strong jets of water to blast these tiny insects off leaves, or remove by hand. If left alone, the numbers of aphids can reproduce rapidly and their feeding may cause crooked stems, deformed leaves and flowers on bulbs. In general, you should walk through the garden regularly for early signs of pests or disease. Any infestation or infection is much easier to control if it is found early.

Succulents- Do not prune them this month.

<u>Fertilization</u>- Do not fertilize this month.
