2006 IN REVIEW—2007 PREVIEW—OFFICE STAFF CHANGING

Happy New Year to everyone. I hope your holiday season was safe and joyous!

A lot was accomplished in 2006 and I'd like to take a moment to reflect on the projects completed:

- The cracks in the pool cool decking were repaired and the entire deck painted. This approach extended the time when a complete resurface will be needed at fraction of the cost.
- The pool furniture reupholstering project was completed.
- The spa was resurfaced.
- The pool and spa were re-caulked to prevent erosion behind the tiles.
- Substantial repairs were made in the clubhouse because of water leaks and resulting mold formation. The roof was repaired in several places. The steam rooms and one of the men's showers were repaired because of water barrier failures.
- New high-definition TVs were installed in the fitness room and the cable service was upgraded to digital high-definition.
- The tennis court fencing frames and light poles were painted.
- The entryway and clubhouse parking lot were seal coated.
- The street signs were completely repainted and now have a 7 year warranty.
- The water fountain at the front of the clubhouse, which had been a source of water incursion and maintenance, was replaced with a desert landscape.
- A large number of landscape lights and transformers were replaced and a regular inspection schedule established to maintain all community lighting.
- The heavy rains required repairs in a number of the common area drainage ways.
- A comprehensive street study was conducted to determine the condition of our roads and establish a maintenance schedule designed to keep them in top shape.

The management company and the Board believe the above projects helped maintain a high standard for the community and enhanced your home values.

As we look toward the first few months of 2007, we will be focusing on four projects: (1) common wall painting, (2) residential unit painting, (3) By Law/C,C,&R revisions and (4) next year's budget. All of these projects are in various stages and will be completed before the end of our fiscal year-hopefully, well before that time.

Patti Smith, our community manager, and **Sheila Ricci**, her assistant, will be moving on to new roles in life effective the first of the year. They have both served our community well and I want to acknowledge their contributions and wish them well. The Board is currently interviewing prospective replacements.

JANUARY IN THE GARDEN

Roses

This is the month to plant bare root roses which you will soon see for sale in garden centers. In selecting roses for your garden, you have many choices.

For large flowers on sturdy stems, choose hybrid tea roses such as:

- Change of Heart (pink blooms with a spicy scent)
- Voluptous (deep pink with sweet scent)
- Elle (shell pink and yellow blooms with a spicy citrus scent)

For large clusters of smaller flowers, consider these new floribunda types:

- Fragrant Wave (white and spicy)
- Tuscan Sun (apricot orange with light spicy scent)

Golden Barrel Cactus

Many residents have Golden Barrel Cacti in their landscape plantings. This golden-spine cactus, also known as mother-in-law's cushion, is recognizable by its distinctive barrel shape. While a slow grower, this species can reach heights of up to 4 feet and can grow as wide as 2 ½ feet.

Grown in a pot, it can take 30 to 40 years to reach a size where it is ready to flower. When it does, showy yellow blossoms burst forth from April through May. Once they reach their peak, the flowers turn into papery seed pods. They like the sun, but prefer some afternoon shade, if possible. Be sure to provide frost protection in winter.

In your landscape, the Golden Barrel Cacti can be effectively used in a number of different ways:

<u>Interspersed</u> - The golden barrel's globe shape is a standout when interspersed with taller plants such as ocotillo, saguaro, or yucca.

<u>Grouped</u> - In large numbers, their cylindrical shape presents a dramatic picture.

<u>Focal Point</u> - Depending on its size, the barrel cactus can sometimes look best alone or surrounded by low-growing desert flowers or vines.

Houseplants

It's time to inspect houseplants for aphids, scale insects, spider mites, and mealybugs. Rinse infected plants with commercial insecticidal soap or a solution of 1 tablespoon of dishwashing liquid mixed with one gallon of water. Blast gray aphids off plants with a strong jet of water.

Considering the harsh conditions under which these plants live we should have great respect for them!

Reminder! - Do not cut back frozen foliage resulting from our winter freeze.
