CLEAN UP, COMPLIANCE, FOR SALE, ELECTION

Happy fall to everyone and welcome back to our part-time residents.

We are still working on getting the damage created by the July 31 storm cleaned up. The items visible by most residents have been accomplished. The more difficult work that needs to be done in the wash areas and behind some of our residents' homes needed careful review and planning. We are now ready to proceed and you should see some progress by the time this letter goes to press.

Over the next few months, we will be increasing our efforts to gain compliance with the CC&Rs and Design Guidelines based on the support demonstrated at the Annual Meeting. Specifically, we will be looking for compliance with the requirement to remove trash cans from the curb and store them out of sight no later than the end of the day of pickup. We will also be looking for landscape light violations (failure to turn them on and improper light fixtures and bulbs). These are very small issues but our Governing Documents indicate it is the Board's responsibility to enforce all of the rules so we plan to do our best to perform our duties.

If you've returned to the community, I'm sure you've noticed the For Sale signs that now appear in front of several homes. The Arizona State legislature passed a law allowing homeowners to post these signs without regard to any CC&R restrictions that prohibited them in the past.

At the June Board meeting, we voted to take no further action to remedy the error made in the election process (see the May Newsletter for an explanation). Our decision was based on advice of counsel, which asserted that the Board had the authority to appoint members to fill the two new Board positions created last year. Although **David Redman** and **Dennis Carson** were seated at the Annual Meeting based on the election results, rather than appointed as required by law, we believed it was unnecessary to go through the formal process of appointment because the end result would be the same. One of our residents disagreed with our decision and filled a complaint with the State of Arizona. To address his concerns, Mr. Redman and Mr. Carson resigned on October 2, 2007. On October 3, 2007, they were appointed to the Board by Unanimous Written Consent.


LOST AND FOUND

NOVEMBER IN THE GARDEN

Watering Considerations

November ushers in milder temperatures, cool nights and short days which lull the plants into a much needed rest now through January. Some plants begin dropping a few leaves, last month's growth spurt slows and citrus fruit begins to color. Although most plants will be dor-

mant soon, they still need to absorb water, but at a much reduced rate. The cool temperatures significantly reduce the loss of water from evaporation. When plants are dormant, they stop actively growing and roots cannot absorb nutrients due to cool soils and inactive roots. So, save your fertilizer for spring. Some specific watering tips:

<u>Bermuda lawns</u>- Apply one inch of water per week to Bermuda lawns. Hint: A light application of potassium in the fall will enable it to come out of dormancy.

Herbs- Water established herbs once a week or less depending on the temperature.

Vegetables- Should be watered every three days.

Bougainvillea

This is the best time of the year to plant Bougainvillea plants and, perhaps, replace many of the ones in the neighborhood that I noticed were leveled by last winter's frost.

Some general guidelines to follow:

- Plant in well-drained soil and full to reflected sun (they will not bloom well in partial shade).
- Feed them lightly in the spring and summer after planting.
- Do not over fertilize them or they will not bloom.
- In early spring, prune the bush after danger of frost to remove dead branches and keep their height in check.

Artichokes

Artichokes are exotic-looking vegetables that can be grown successfully here in Arizona. A new desert strain that is more sun-tolerant and a better producer is now available at local nurseries. Some guidelines to follow:

- Select an area that provides ample sun and room for this large plant to grow.
- Spray to control aphids.
- Harvest buds while they are still tight and plump (the bud is actually the marketable portion of the plant). If not cut, buds soon open into thistle-like flowers that can be used in flower arrangements.

Miscellaneous

<u>Seeds</u> - Soaking seeds overnight in warm water helps speed germination in many species. This is especially true for hard-coated seeds like beans, beets, chervil, cilantro, dill, lavender, peas and spinach. <u>Frost</u>- Watch for frosty nights, and be prepared to cover tender crops. Most cool-season vegetables are unaffected by frost.

<u>Cleanup</u>- It's time to clean up the entire garden. Pull weeds and take out spent annuals and vegetables which can harbor insects and diseases during the winter season.

I moved here two years ago and was glad to see that the City of Scottsdale had a recycling program—those mauve containers make it so easy to recycle! I thought I knew what could—and could not—be recycled, but recently I decided to double-check the city's Web site. I was surprised to find that I had been recycling some items on the "Do Not Recycle" list. In case you haven't checked the list recently, what follows are the guidelines for recycling:

- Do not use your recycling container for non-recyclables (like grass/yard/food waste).
- Additional recycling containers are provided for free if you need additional capacity.
