I've been away on a trip most of August and when I returned I couldn't think of anything very new to inform our residents about. Accordingly, I'll just update you on the status of some ongoing projects.

- 1. <u>View Fence Painting</u>—The Board is still looking at accomplishing this in the spring of next year. At our August 28th Board meeting, we will consider a solution that will allow residents who don't wish to remove their rabbit fences or cut back their shrubs to "opt out" of the painting.
- **2.** <u>Tennis Court Fence Repair and Crack Sealing</u>—Bids have been received for these projects and are being analyzed for presentation to the Board.
- **3.** <u>Street Sealing</u>—The proposed contract for Sunland Asphalt to perform this work in late September is being forwarded to us for review. As soon as it is approved and signed, we will notify the community of the exact dates this work will be accomplished.

An on-going but somewhat minor problem is what we might want to do differently about providing shade in the pool area. We started the summer with 10 umbrellas and we now have 4 left. We've purchased them for as low as \$60 apiece and as high as \$300. It doesn't seem to make any difference on how long they last. All it takes is for the umbrella to be left open and a good wind will knock it over and break one of the spines. One solution the Board will consider is putting in a permanent shade structure of some kind—more about this as we look at options and costs.

SEPTEMBER IN THE GARDEN

Most months I provide you with guidance and encouragement in maintaining your garden. This month I'd like to point out that a surprising number of plants that we grow as houseplants and in the garden have parts that are potentially poisonous for us and our pets. Some contain elements that irritate the skin or could be poisonous to the touch. Those of us who have allergies must be es-

pecially careful and should wear rubber gloves when handling plants. If you have small children in the house, it is best to totally avoid certain plants.

Dangerous Plants

Some entire plant families are poisonous and sometimes only particular plants in a family should be avoided. The complete list is too long to be included in the newsletter so we'll highlight some of the more dangerous and/or popular.

All *Euphoriaceae* contain a whitish sap (Latex) which can irritate the skin. Among the most popular are: **Poinsettia**, **Croton**, and **Acalypa**.

Lantana, Philodendron, and Calla Lilly (all parts).

Natal Plum (all parts except fruits), Honeysuckle (berries) and Asparagus (berries).

Amaryllis, Tulip, Narcissus, Hyacinth, and Clivia are among those which can produce vomiting, nausea and diarrhea.

Proper Handling of Plants

Always wash your hands after working with these plants if sap or cell juice oozes out. The sap can cause swelling of the conjunctiva and changes in the cornea of the eye. It can also produce major swellings and acute pain on the mucous membranes of the mouth and throat. Many plants produce berries which can cause nausea, vomiting and stomach pains followed by sleepiness and widening of the pupils.

Children

If children have ingested parts of a plant, you must find a doctor immediately. Take the plant with you for positive identification. Make the person who has swallowed the plant vomit. Give children a drink of warm water. Never drink milk as it binds the fatty poisons and encourages the body to take up more.

Pets

Plants that endanger humans can also be dangerous to our pets...cats, dogs, caged birds, rabbits, hamsters, and guinea pigs. Any pet that can roam freely in the house or garden can be poisoned by eating growing plants. Cats that don't go outside may try to satisfy their need for grass by nibbling on house-plants as they require greens for their digestion. Animals do not necessarily know instinctively which plants may harm them. Put a bowl of oat grass on the windowsill for your cat and that will satisfy the need to nibble.

Dogs too get hurt- for example, by the points of agaves. Because cats and dogs will drink any water, they can also be endangered by plant remedies and fertilizers that have been dissolved in leftover plant water. Remember, many plants have been studied extensively and are used to make medicines that cure us. Just be careful around plants and treat them with respect.

In the Bellasera Design Guidelines, add the following to page 15-A, # 9:

CASITA'S

ADDITIONAL CONSTRUCTION OR CHANGES TO THE EXTERIOR OF YOUR HOME. Del Webb 2000.

Submit all exterior improvements to the Bellasera Modifications Committee prior to installation. All construction or changes to the exterior of a lot requires prior approval of the Modifications Committee. The committee reviews and confirms compliance of the development in accordance with a comprehensive set of design standards and guidelines. These standards cover such items as building heights, exterior colors and materials, as well as other architectural elements, such as artwork, antennae, playhouses, landscaping and fences. This review procedure allows the Association to provide fellow members comfort that all improvements will meet or exceed Bellasera's uniform standards. Confirmation of compliance of any changes must be obtained prior to starting them.

Residents also have to obtain Permits from the City of Scottsdale prior to building and a copy of the Permits must be included with their application to the Modifications Committee.
