Delinquent Dues

As mentioned at the annual meeting, Owners' unpaid dues are excessive. Fortunately, we have very few Owners who are delinquent and our financial health is not impaired. While it is unfortunate that some Owners may be suffering economic distress, it is just not fair to other Owners to carry all the financial burdens of the Association.

The Association's general practice has been to refer the claim to legal counsel who will get a lien on the delinquent Owner's property. Although legal counsel will try to collect what is owed, we usually wait until the property is sold to recover unpaid dues. This approach takes far too long, and most often very little, if anything, is collected before or after the sale. This process has not been very productive. Also, although anecdotal, some in the real estate industry may be telling listing sellers to stop paying dues. I can only guess this advice is premised on the belief that there will not be enough money left over from the sale to pay the Association's lien, the Association will abandon its collection efforts, and the unpaid dues may never have to be paid.

The Association now believes it's time for a more aggressive approach to deal with some of our receivables. In addition to liens, the Association has authorized immediate action in AZ Small Claims Court to pursue a judgment against certain Owners. A judgment gives the Association an important tool earlier in the collection process. An Owner with a judgment on their record may take his/her financial obligations to the Association more seriously. We don't know how successful this will be, but we will try.

June in the Garden

Our wonderful late May weather, with temperatures well below normal, has certainly not conditioned us for hot weather. Rest assured, as we enter June and approach the summer, garden topics related to warm weather like *heat stress and fertilization* will be important. And, if you've planted a *vegetable garden*, it's time for some advice on when to harvest your crop.

Heat Stress

June is always hot and usually dry. Consequently, you need to be sure that your watering system is working properly and that your plants are being watered sufficiently to avoid heat stress. Two items in your garden that are prone to heat stress are fruit trees and plants in containers.

<u>Fruit Trees</u>- Fruit trees suffer from heat stress easily if they are drought stressed. Symptoms include:

- -Splitting fruit
- -Yellowing leaves and
- -Yellow or brown sunburn patches on both leaves and bark.

The best treatment is to maintain a steady, regular deep watering schedule and wait for the temperatures to calm. If the symptoms seem extreme or prolonged, or the plant is less than two years old, shade the tree and the bark, or both, for the summer.

<u>Plants in containers</u>- These plants should be watered daily, preferably early in the morning. Be sure the water flows out the bottom of the pot with each watering. You should also consider spraying the leaves which will increase humidity for the plant. On extremely hot days (over 110 degrees) spraying the plant in the evening will cool the plant and mitigate the heat stress.

Fertilization

It is best not to fertilize this month as the tender new growth may burn quickly in the heat of early summer. If you choose to fertilize, do so only once at half strength. Fertilizers, especially inorganic ones, are high in salts that can accumulate quickly in the dry, hot conditions of summer.

Vegetables

The fun of growing vegetables is eating them! However, it is sometimes difficult to tell when they are ready to eat. If you have planted vegetables in your garden, use some of the following tips to determine when your vegetables are ready to eat.

Cantaloupe- Pick these when the skin is well netted and the fruit slips from the vine with little pressure.

<u>Corn</u>- This seasonal treat is ready to eat when the tassel turns brown, milk comes out of the kernels when you gently cut them with a fingernail, and all the kernels are full size.

Eggplant- When the skin is firm, dark and shiny and the fruit has stopped growing.

<u>Oriental-type eggplants</u> -These can be harvested anytime after they are 3 inches long as they keep longer on the plant without becoming bitter.
