Roads, Pool Furniture, Lighting

The parking lot at the clubhouse, and the front and rear entry roads are looking pretty worn and need resealing. When the roads were last sealed a couple of years ago, our consultant reviewed these areas and advised us the surface was not suitable for accepting the seal. The previous seal was improperly applied, and applying a new seal on top of the defective seal would only cause more headaches later. We were advised to wait a couple of years until the old seal became more worn. Well, our consultant is coming out this week to review the condition of these areas, and I am hopeful the timing is now right and we will be able to apply a fresh seal very soon.

For those who frequent the pool, you may have noticed that the furniture cushion fabric is worn and sun bleached. New replacement cushions have been ordered. The contractor will provide one set of chair cushions and one set of lounge cushions to inspect before the final go-ahead, but we anticipate new cushions this summer. The frames will be cleaned. Painting the frames is not in the immediate plan, but that is always a possibility after we see how the cleaning goes.

Finally, I want to remind everyone about the duty to keep the front lights in working order, and the bulbs should comply with our Design Guidelines and the law. We are subject to Scottsdale's Environmentally Sensitive Lands Ordinance. Scottsdale's web site tells us the lighting source must be hidden from view and "the maximum capacity of the lighting fixture is 50 watts for incandescent and florescent lighting sources,..." Many residents have what appear to be 120 watt spot lights in the front lights, which are too bright. Brighter is not better. The idea here is not to flood the front of the house and driveway with light. One should not be able to see the bulb from the street. A better solution is a 60-watt equivalent compact fluorescent light bulb that uses only 13 watts but equivalent to a 60-watt incandescent spotlight, is well recessed within the fixture, consumes little power, and splashes light softly on the driveway.

July in the Garden

Pets and Gardens

Many of us here in Bellasera have cats and/or dogs and should be aware of the potential problems that our gardens pose to our best friends. The following plants (compiled by Phoenix Home and Garden- April 2007) are known to be toxic to our animals.

- -Aloe (foliage)
- -Castor Bean (all parts)
- -Coral Bean (seeds)
- -Day lily and other lilies (foliage /cats only)
- -Lantana (foliage)
- -Oleander (all parts)
- -Sacred dutura (all parts)
- -Sago palm (all parts)
- -Texas mountain laurel (seeds)
- -Tomato (foliage)
- -Cocoa hull mulch (contains similar compounds as chocolate)

Fertilizers or pesticides which may be ingested (such as ant, roach or slug bait) should not be applied where animals walk as they may later lick their paws and swallow the residue.

Native Tree Maintenance

Summer is the ideal time to prune native desert trees because they are actively growing and can recover quickly. If you do prune, follow these guidelines:

- 1. Do not remove more than one-quarter of a tree's branches in a year. Cutting off too much foliage "starves" the plant by reducing its ability to synthesize.
- 2. It is advisable to hold off any pruning for at least one year after planting. Two years is even better. If you allow as many branches as possible to survive, the tree will develop strength and trunk girth.

Weeping sap may be worse if the tree is stressed for moisture, so be sure that your trees are appropriately watered.

Mildew

We are currently experiencing our normal dry heat. However, as we approach the monsoon season, humidity will increase and create perfect conditions for mildew to erupt. This is especially a problem with zinnia and sunflower. Preventative steps are:

- -Water plants from below to prevent spreading the spores from the ground onto the leaves.
- -Provide plenty of mulch to reduce water loss and prevent splashing.
- -Remove infected leaves quickly and pick up those that fall around plants as they are full of spores.

Since Annuals have a short life span, they are rarely worth an aggressive spraying campaign. If they become too infested...pull them out.

Miscellaneous

Watch for *grasshoppers* or other chewing insects that may arrive in large numbers this year. If there are only a few, handpick these. Otherwise, apply products specifically formulated for large infestations.

Do not fertilize or prune your vegetable plants this month.
