Streets, Gate Keypad

At newsletter deadline, cold weather has forced a change to the planned schedule for resurfacing of some of our streets. The best way to keep informed is by making sure your e-mail address is included on the 'blasts' that are sent. See page 2 for more information.

The sink hole on Ponte Bella has been repaired. You may have noticed there were a number of patches to the pavement in the areas to be seal coated. Some of our streets are over 10 years old, and the base under some areas settled or shifted causing the pavement to crack to the point where replacement was necessary. I'm aware these repairs have taken a long time to get done, and I appreciate everyone's patience.

The keypad at the front gate has now been relocated to the guest lane but it is not yet operational. I anticipate that I will be able to announce the activation of the keypad in the near future. Once the keypad becomes operational, we will send out a notice of the hours that the keypad will be operational, and instructions on how to manage the assignment of individual codes on the QuickPass website. We will keep everyone advised as this progresses.

December in the Garden

Our low temperatures last week should have convinced you that winter is upon us. Our change in season provides ideal conditions to perform a variety of garden tasks that include planting and pruning as well as monitoring the weather and harvesting citrus. So, let's review some of our garden chores for December.

Planting/Harvesting

<u>Citrus</u>- Continue to harvest citrus, testing for sweetness. If small fruit size is noticed it may be due to heavy fruit set or the weather. Lack of normal rainfall during the mid-summer period can influence fruit size. Citrus fruit growth is greater as a response to rain versus a similar amount of irrigation.

<u>Roses</u>- New rose catalogs should be out this month and bare root plants are available at nurseries. Plant bare root roses in a 2 foot by 2 foot hole that is well amended with organic matter.

Miscellaneous- Some additional items to consider planting this month are:

- -Cool-hardy trees, shrubs and vines.
- -Cool season vegetables, annuals, perennials and bulbs.
- -Bare root deciduous fruit trees. Select varieties that require less than 400 hours of chilling. Your local nursery can help you find those.

Pruning

Now is a good time to start thinning, pruning, and reshaping many of our desert trees such as mesquite, palo verde, acacia, and other deciduous trees. Tree sap has moved down into the root system making it the most desirable time to thin and prune. Some guidelines:

- -Remove touching branches that cross over each other and limbs that rub against structures and neighboring trees.
- -Thin overall to decrease the trees susceptibility to wind damage.

December is also a good time to prune Texas sage, roses and other desert and deciduous shrubs.

Do not prune frost sensitive plants such as bougainvillea and hibiscus.

Weather

<u>Temperature</u>- Monitor weather forecasts for possible freezes and be prepared to protect frost tender plants. Wrap young citrus and other frost tender trees with cloth, cardboard, or layers of newspapers, never plastic. Leave them wrapped until the danger of frost is over.

Rain- December is one of our rainiest months and rain is vital for the success of your trees. If rains are abundant or occur regularly, established desert trees will not need supplemental irrigation.

Grass

For those of you with winter grass, be aware of fungal disease which usually results from too much water. If conditions have encouraged fungal disease to get started, the increasing temperatures of late winter will cause it to flourish. Prevent these problems by watering your lawn early in the morning (two or three hours before dawn) while the weather is cooler.

Lastly, a holiday tip: Christmas tree trunks need a fresh cut to promoter water uptake before being put in the Christmas tree stand.
