Board of Director Seats

The Board is pleased to announce the December 15 appointment of **Ed Szkaradnik** as the newest member of our Board and **Ed's** subsequent appointment as Treasurer. **Ed** fills the seat recently vacated by **Ted Dixon**. After the welcome addition of **Ed**, there still remain three seats on our Board which must be filled by election at our annual meeting on April 22, 2012.

The January newsletter addressed the open Board seats and brought us three responses with suggestions for improvements to our Association. However, none of the three individuals volunteered to join the Board where they could directly influence the direction of the community.

Filling these seats is not optional for our Association. Without volunteers, the management agent can accomplish some tasks, but only a duly-elected Board can make key business decisions such as levying and collecting assessments, entering into contracts or committing funds. Without a functioning Board, the operation of our community will stall and we will all suffer the consequences.

Last Gate Opener Event

Our final transponder transition event will be held on **Saturday**, **March 10**, **2012**, from **9:30 a.m.** until **1:30 p.m.** On April 2, 2012, the old transponders will be deactivated.

To date <u>244 residents</u> and <u>429 vehicles</u> have completed the process. We're pleased to report that our experience so far has been very positive.

The March 10 event will be open to BCA Owners purchasing transponders for vehicles registered in the name of the Owner or a spouse, and full time lessees who have a Lease Certification on file at the clubhouse office. "Owner" is defined in our CC&Rs. Bellasera Owners/spouses and lessees should come to the clubhouse on Saturday to register and purchase new transponders, and have them installed on their cars.

The transition process involves registering and matching each new transponder (with proper identification) to the Owner and their registered vehicle(s). The paperwork for the registration process should be completed at the clubhouse. Once the registration process is completed those individuals will be asked to drive their vehicle to the front gate for temporary placement and testing. If the transponder works properly, it will be permanently installed on the windshield. The new windshield transponders are permanent once installed and cannot be transferred between vehicles.

No One Will Be Permitted To Do a Self-Installation.

Normally the cost of a new transponder is \$25.00 for each vehicle registered in the name of an Owner/spouse. The cost of all other transponders is \$35.00. However, as an introductory offer, Owners may purchase two new transponders prior to April 1, 2012, for \$12.50 each. The cost of the new transponders may be paid by check (preferred to expedite processing) payable to Bellasera Community Association, cash, or added to your account for payment on the next quarterly statement.

Again, the March 10 event will begin at **9:30 a.m.** and run until **1:30 p.m.** In order to ensure a smooth effort, please take note of the following:

- Residents may come at any time, but in the interest of avoiding a logjam (and if your schedule allows), it would be helpful if residents whose last name begins with the letters <u>A through L</u> could arrive between <u>9:30 a.m. and 11:00 am</u> and residents whose last name begins with the letters M through Z arrive between 11:00 a.m. and 1:30 p.m.
- Bring a copy of your driver's license and vehicle registration so we can match the transponder to the Owner and vehicle.
- Resident Owners should complete the Vehicle/Driver Information sheet prior to arrival. This will help expedite the process. The *form is attached to this newsletter* and also is available at the Bellasera office.
- Renters should also complete the Vehicle/Driver Information sheet and a Lease Certification Form that is available in the office (if one is not already on file). A copy of your lease is also required. New transponders issued to tenants/renters will be programmed to automatically deactivate on the lease termination date.
- IMPORTANT: Your current hard black transponders must be turned in before you can purchase a new transponder (one for one). Please bring them with you.

Please remember we're all volunteers trying to do the best we can, so bring along your patience and sense of humor with you.

We continue to offer the opportunity for individual resident transponder installation(s) every Thursday between 10 a.m. and 2 p.m. Please contact Sharon for an appointment.

Bellasera Neighborhood News, February 2002, 10 years ago

- Celebrate Valentine's Day by bringing a chocolate dessert to a "Death" by Chocolate Dessert Party" on Sunday, Feb. 10 at 7 p.m. at the clubhouse. Coffee and tea will be provided.
- Have you noticed a significant increase in private aircraft traffic above Bellasera over the course of the past year? Christiane Chenault has, and thus joined a group to meet with aviation officials to seek solutions. One of the first steps taken, she said, was a meeting with representatives of the Sky Harbor and Deer Valley Airports, representatives of two local flight training schools and FAA officials on Jan. 16. Future meetings are expected as well.
- A key element in solving issues raised at the November Town Hall meeting is the formation of several short-term committees to examine the issues and report to the Board. Now we need volunteers to staff the committees.
- As of January 15, our Community Manager, Erin Bridgforth, has received only two applications for serving on the committees. We urgently need up to 16 more volunteers.

February in the Garden

February brings us Valentine's Day and, perhaps, thoughts of roses. As it happens, February is a good month to pay attention to the roses in your garden as well as pruning, pests and watering needs.

Roses

<u>Bare Root Roses</u> – These should be planted by mid-month. If you've never attempted them, give it a try as there are a variety of beautiful choices such as: *floribunda*, *grandi*-

flora, hybrid tea, miniature, polyantha, shrub roses and climbers.

<u>Container Grown Roses</u> – These can be planted until early spring. Check and be sure that they have been in the container long enough for new roots to have been formed and were not simply bare root roses moved to a container recently.

<u>Established Roses</u> – These can be fertilized around mid-month which is weeks before a target bloom date of April 1. Some gardeners wait until the first growth has reached 2 inches in length before applying fertilizer. Any necessary pruning should be finished by mid-month.

Pruning/Watering

<u>Pruning-</u> Finish pruning *nonnative deciduous shade trees and deciduous fruit trees* by mid-month. Prune frost sensitive citrus after they begin to leaf out, if needed. As a general rule, citrus needs to be pruned only if there are aberrant branches ruining the shape of the tree.

<u>Watering</u> – Continue to water citrus and landscape plants deeply once every 3 to 4 weeks unless rain is adequate (which it hasn't been) to provide freeze protection.

Pests

February is a good month to pay attention to pests as they attempt to gain a foothold in your garden. The following are the most common ones you'll find here in your garden.

<u>Aphids</u> – These are tiny insects that suck the sap from fresh growth on many plants. They are usually *green* or *grayish-black* and prefer cool weather. They are often found in tight clusters on:

- Rosebuds. - Tender shoots of shrubs - Annual flowers.

If discovered early, they can be controlled with a strong stream of water on a regular basis. If this doesn't work, try a soapy spray of one teaspoon of concentrated liquid dish detergent to one gallon of water. Spray early in the day and test a few leaves for soap burn before spraying the entire plant.

<u>Thrips</u> – These minute insects appear on flower buds of roses. They will mar the flower, or its outer petals, but require no control unless you plan to enter your roses in a show where perfect plants are required. Otherwise, the damage is only cosmetic and won't affect the plant.

<u>Friendly Bugs</u> – Ladybugs and green lacewings appear later this month and are natural predators of aphids. They have voracious appetites and help keep them under control. Everyone knows what a ladybug looks like. The green lacewing has long, delicate antennae, a slender greenish body, golden- or copper-colored eyes, and two pairs of veined wings.

Did You Know?

Native peoples planted by the signs of nature. When mesquite trees began to leaf out in late February/early March, it was time to plant crops. So, prepare your garden soil for spring planting. Trees, shrubs, groundcovers, and native plants can develop root systems before the heat hits.
