Board & Committees Busy

Your Board and the various committees have been busy this past month attending to a number of matters and issues. Several items of attention and interest are:

Pool Deck Resurfacing. The new "cool deck" resurfacing and resealing of the pool deck has been completed and is certainly a major improvement and enhancement over its previous condition.

Additional Stop Signs. The Board accepted and approved the recommendation of the Security Committee to install additional Stop Signs in the Bellasera Community. The "T" intersection where Ponte Bella Drive coming from the Main Gate meets Corva Drive will become a 3-way stop. Several other connector streets that dead end onto the busier through streets will also get a new Stop Sign.

Tennis Courts – Solutions. Our remaining two tennis courts are subject to continual cracking and ongoing maintenance issues. These problems are the direct result of a deficient subsurface preparation when the courts were originally installed 15 years ago. The two courts were resurfaced just last year, but new hairline cracks reappeared in short order. While these new cracks have now been repaired at no additional cost to the Association under the warranty from our contractor, a more permanent and cost-effective solution is warranted. The Band Aid approach of continual and ongoing repair and maintenance is costly and undesirable. A complete demolition and proper reconstruction of the existing courts is one answer (and we have funds in our Association Reserves currently identified for that purpose) but is several years away. To get ahead of this problem the Building and Grounds Committee, with the support of the Board, is currently investigating several alternative and potentially cost-effective near-term solutions. We encourage our tennis playing members to attend our Building and Grounds Committee meetings and solicit their input on this issue as we explore these options.

June in the Garden

Summer Is Around The Corner!

May was certainly a pleasant surprise as it contributed to a beautiful spring with mostly below average temperatures, especially at night and early mornings. However, June is guaranteed to bring warmer temperatures and, unfortunately, it is normally the driest month of the year. So, it is time to repeat summer <u>Watering Guidelines</u>:

<u>How Much</u> - Ensure that you are deep watering your landscape plants to prevent salt build-up. Use a soil probe or a long-handled screw-driver to determine how deeply water is penetrating. A simple guideline is the **1-2-3** Rule:

1 foot deep for small, shallow rooted plants.

2 feet deep for shrubs.

3 feet deep for trees.

Remember to let soil dry between watering's.

<u>How Often</u> – An often asked question and, in addition to the guidelines below, it is important to take into consideration weather, soil conditions, plant maturity and how well the plant has adapted to the desert.

Irrigation guidelines for established plants are:

Desert-adapted trees- 7-21 days

Non-Desert adapted trees- 7-14 days

Desert shrubs- 7-21 days

Non-Desert adapted shrubs- 5-7 days

What To Plant

In addition to summer flowers, some suggestions are:

<u>Basil</u>- Sow seeds or transplants. Basil performs well in pots with consistent soil moisture and morning sun. Basil plants (in small pots) are widely available right now and inexpensive (\$2-\$3).

<u>Sunflowers</u>- Sow seeds in a sunny spot where you can enjoy seeing the blooms' cheerful-looking faces during summer. In fall, sunflower seeds attract goldfinches. Pollen-free 'Chocolate Cherry' features unusual dark-chocolate centers surrounded by chocolate-burgundy petals. Other colorful options include 'Autumn Beauty', 'Evening Sun', and 'Lemon Queen'. 'Snack Seed' and 'Mammoth Russian' produce lots of plump edible seeds. In limited space or containers, try dwarf 'Junior' and 'Teddy Bear.' Find seeds at Southwest Gardener, Phoenix, **swgardener.com**.

<u>Black-Eyed Peas</u>- (I mentioned these last month and decided to expand on them.) Grown for food and as a cover crop to improve soil fertility, annual black-eyed peas (cowpeas) are well-suited to arid gardens. Once established, these plants are drought-tolerant heat lovers and, like all legumes, produce their own nitrogen and do not need rich soil or fertilizer to grow. Dense plantings of black-eyed peas shade weed seeds so they will not multiply, and blossoms attract beneficial insects. Seeds germinate readily when soil temperatures reach 65 degrees. Calcium-rich shelled peas can be used fresh or dried. Find heirloom varieties at **victory-seeds.com**.

Miscellaneous

<u>Feed potted cacti</u>—Unlike most plants, cacti do not require much nitrogen. Choose a product with a lower nitrogen percentage than phosphorus or potassium, such as 1-7-6, or use an organic product that releases nutrients slowly to prevent fast growth that makes the plant susceptible to splitting. If using an inorganic product not formulated for cacti, feed at a diluted rate (one-half or less the label strength) to prevent root burn.

<u>Water herbs effectively</u>- Herbs require good soil drainage, as their roots can rot in wet soil. (Lavender, Rosemary and Sage are more susceptible to root rot than others). Apply water two times per week, soaking to a depth of 1 foot to leach salts past the root zone.

<u>Mulch</u> – As mentioned last month, apply mulch to soil surfaces of trees, shrubs and flowerbeds to keep root zones cooler and minimize loss of water through evaporation. Mulch can be inorganic (gravel, fabric) or organic (wood chips, pine bark or needles, chopped leaves)


<u>Citrus</u>- Citrus fruit drop should be finished by this month and new fruits should be forming. If you didn't do so last month, **fertilize**. The next time is August/September prior to fruit sizing time.
