## **Easement Litigation & Noise Abatement**

#### Easement Litigation Settlement Is Now Final

As I reported last month, on June 9 the Judge in our case denied the Motion of one of our homeowners, who objected to the terms of our settlement, to reopen the case. The time to appeal the Court's denial has now passed, our Settlement is now final and the case has been dismissed. As a reminder, a copy of the recorded Easement granting access through Bellasera to the owners of the adjacent 12-acre parcel is posted on the Bellasera website, **azbellasera.org**, under the "Adjacent Property Easement" tab.

We have seen no further activity to date regarding any efforts to develop the adjacent 12-acre parcel or placement of any new cell towers thereon and will keep the community advised when any such information comes to our attention.

#### Noise Abatement/Vendor Community Access Policy Update

There is apparently some confusion regarding the Board's recently adopted Noise Abatement policy which limits the days and times that vendors/contractors will be granted access to the community and to perform their work.

Simply stated, vendors and contractors will only be admitted to Bellasera through the front security gate and allowed to work in the community, from 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, and from 7:00 a.m. through 3:00 p.m. on Saturday. No vendors or contractors will be admitted or allowed to work in the community on Sundays or on the following major holidays: **New Years Day**; **Memorial Day**; **Fourth of July**; **Thanksgiving**; and **Christmas Day**. No exceptions will be made except in the event of an emergency.

Examples of such 'emergency' situations are: fire and weather emergencies; medical emergencies; emergency plumbing/water/electrical repair; emergency air conditioning/heating repair; restoration of telephone service; service vehicles from the utility companies; and 'house checking' services. Standard plumbing/electrical/air conditioning/heating/cable TV and other similar repairs and installations do not constitute emergencies.

Please schedule your vendors and contractors with these limitations in mind.

Recently the Board members voted in the new Noise Policy. Living here in Bellasera I like the idea about no noise from gas powered blowers, chain saws, hedgers, jack hammers, construction workers on room additions, roofing Contractors, etc.

The problem I am having with the new Noise Policy is this policy also says that "All Vendors" are not allowed in Bellasera on Holidays.

This is where I think the Board members need to review this new policy again and look at "All Vendors" not allowed to work on Holidays.

I work with a lot of "vendors", e.g., window cleaners, housekeepers, pool services, car detailers, etc. These type of services do not make outside noise like blowers do.

The pool service companies get upset because on Friday or Mondays, which Holidays usually happen on, they can get backlogged up to 10 homes because they are not allowed in Bellasera because of the new policy.

On the 4th of July we had our first Monsoon storm and the wind, dust, & heavy rains arrived. Some homeowners needed immediate help following the aftermath for planned 4th of July parties. The Guard Gate said "no one allowed in", only A/C repair companies.

They asked me to help them clean up their pools and windows due to the monsoon rain because these vendors are not allowed in.

Maybe the Board members can review this policy and allow the Guard House to just figure if a truck & trailer pulls up on Holidays full of tools -- landscapers. These contractors will not be allowed in. A pool service company, house keeping services, window cleaners would be. Please think about this.

Vendors are starting to call Bellasera, where I Live, "Bellasera Home Society", "Old Folks Subdivision", and have said they do not want to work here any more. Also, landscapers & pool services have mentioned to me to ask the Board to approve Summer Hours Only, 6 a.m. to 5 p.m., June, July, August.

Vendors that make noise -- not allowed in on Holidays.

Thank you for your time. Please think about it.

#### **August in the Garden**

#### The Monsoon and Your Garden!

With our recent storms, I'm sure you are well aware of and have an appreciation for our monsoon season and the changes that it can bring to the desert, not always for the good when you have to deal with high winds along with the beneficial rains. However, as the monsoon gets into full swing, it triggers some important garden events related to **planting**, **maintenance** and **pests** that you should be aware of and take necessary action where required. I'll cover each of these below.

#### **Vegetable Planting**

August is the start of our late summer/early fall vegetable planting season and continues into November. If you'd like to try your hand, consider one or more from the following list.

Next month I'll go over the major keys to success regarding site **selection** and **soil preparation**. However, if you are getting started in August refer to the August 2007 Bellasera Newsletter which can be found in our "Newsletter Archives", **azbellasera.org**.

#### **Garden Maintenance**

- --Fertilize Citrus Apply one-third of a tree's annual nitrogen requirement in August or September. Amounts vary depending on the tree's maturity, type of fruit (i.e., grapefruit trees in the ground 5 or more years require half the amount of nitrogen as other citrus), and the percentage of nitrogen in the product.
- --Replenish Mulch As needed, replenish several inches of bark chips, compost, dried leaves, grass clippings, pine needles, straw or a mix of these as top dressing in garden beds, containers, around the root zones of landscape plants and on permeable paths. Mulch reduces soil temperatures, maintains soil moisture and inhibits weeds. Granite mulch performs these same functions, although the above organic mulches add nutrients to the soil as they break down.

#### **Garden Observations**

--Monitor Yellow Foliage—*Iron Chlorosis* appears in new leaves that turn yellow but have obvious green veins. This condition may be apparent in non-native plants during monsoons and can occur when: (1) The soils remain overly wet due to heavy rains and (2) Your automatic irrigation system continues to run.

The excess moisture displaces the oxygen in the soil that roots require in order to absorb iron. The desert's alkaline soil also contributes to *iron chlorosis* in non-native plants. Native plants, on the other hand, have adapted to alkaline soil and seldom, if ever, experience *iron chlorosis*. If your soil is not wet and non-native plants exhibit this condition, apply iron chelates or ferrous sulfate. Finally, if the condition is not severe, it may self-correct when soil moisture returns to normal levels after the monsoons.

--Roses: Cut back on fertilizing established roses to encourage plants to slow down for the hot summer; Water deeply as temperatures climb; Hose off plants in the early morning to increase humidity and control spider mites.

#### **Garden Pests**

- --Eliminate mosquito breeding areas Monsoon rains can dump a deluge of water in minutes, filling shallow depressions in the soil or saucers beneath plants. Mosquitoes can breed in very shallow water. Make sure that any standing pools of water on the ground drain within 24 hours, and empty saucers beneath containers or other receptacles holding water.
- --Hose off dusty plants Summer storms promote populations of spider mites, which thrive on dusty foliage and are especially attracted to roses but appear on many plants. Look for their telltale fine webbing or a rusty appearance on leaves. Hose off plants early in the morning before the sun heats up. Spray as often as needed to remove dust or to control mites.
- --Control crickets Although they do not bite or carry disease, their chirping indoors may drive you crazy. Keep them out of the house by caulking and sealing all cracks and openings. Natural predators include birds, lizards, spiders and cats.
- --Monitor plants for spider mites Barely visible with the naked eye, mites may be detected by their fine webbing or tiny yellow spots where they suck the juice from leaves. Mite populations increase during the monsoon season, when blowing winds create dusty plant foliage—their preferred environment. Wash off dusty foliage regularly with a blast of water from the hose. Spray early in the morning before the sun gets too hot. (If you have a gardening question, please contact the Maricopa County Cooperative Extension Service at 602-470-8086.)
