Board President's Report

Lone Mountain Trail Update – The Easement to construct and use the trail extension across the adjacent Wallace Trust property to connect to the existing trail on Lone Mountain has now been executed by all parties. Construction will begin in December and should be completed early in the new year. Stay tuned for an official announcement of the trail's opening.

Elliptical Machines In Clubhouse – We have lately been experiencing some maintenance issues with two of our three Elliptical machines in the Clubhouse work-out area. These machines are not designed to be peddled backwards which degrades their timing belts. We have had to repair the timing belt on the new Elliptical (which was covered under our warranty) but the timing belt on an older machine had to be replaced at our cost. Signs have been placed on each Elliptical machine directing users <u>not</u> to peddle backwards.

House Number Visibility - As we have discussed in many prior newsletter postings, the address numbers on many homes in Bellasera are so faded as to be unreadable from the street. This poses a problem for vendors and our Manager when they make regular inspections of our community. Magic Markers have been available in the clubhouse office for residents to use to darken house numbers on their home for some time. The Board has now adopted a policy requiring all house numbers to be clearly visible from the street. If your home address is one that needs darkening, please pick up a marker from the Management Office to darken it yourself or make other arrangements to have this corrected.

Updated Facilities Policy - To take into account certain liability issues, the Board has further revised its Facilities Policies and Fee Schedule to allow for events of no more than 20 persons in the pool area. Manager's Memo



A proposal was submitted on September 16 to the City of Scottsdale Development Review Board for a 64-bed specialized residential health care facility at the southwest corner of Scottsdale Road and Lone Mountain Road.

The applicant proposes to create a unique senior assisted living residential facility to allow residents of this area to "age in place" with their families, friends, and support in close proximity.

A marketing study done in 2009 confirmed the "age-on-place" concept is strongly supported by the demographic profile and trends of North Scottsdale.

Bellasera in the Rear View Mirror

A look back in Bellasera history that may bring back memories for long-time residents and be of interest to those not living in our community in prior years. Clips from past newsletters follow.

Bellasera Neighborhood News, October 2004, 10 years ago

- This month I want to address the subject of leasing your home in Bellasera, to remind you of the procedures and to high-light your rights and obligations. The CC&Rs provide most of the information. I have added some other considerations. LEASING IN A NUTSHELL Although leasing is permitted, you may only lease your whole house (not a room, not a casita) and it must be for 30 days or longer. You must notify the Board of Directors (gate guard or manager will do) within ten days. You must make documents (CC&Rs, By-laws) available to the lessee. And you must turn over your clubhouse keys to the lessee, since you are assigning your rights to use the facilities (clubhouse, pool, courts) to him or her. You and your family are not authorized to use the facilities while your home is leased. Lastly, you, the owner, are ultimately responsible for the maintenance of your property. THE REST OF THE STORY The provisions of the CC&Rs are for the benefit of us all. They are intended not to limit people's rights, but to protect the residential, owner-occupied character of our Bellasera community. We should respect them. —Dick Chenault
- ROAD RESURFACING SET FOR OCT. 11-16 Resurfacing of the newer portions of Bellasera's roads will take place the
 week of Oct. 10 and will require road closures. The work will be done in three sections. The first section will begin at 7
 a.m. Monday, Oct. 11
- Plans for a fall art and crafts show and sale by Bellasera residents have been dropped because a suitable date could not be found. The coordinator for the Creative Hands show and sale, Janet Biondo, explained that the group of artists will attempt to arrange a show and sale next year.
- Keven Peterson, our officer-in-charge at the front gate, last month marked his fifth year manning the post at Bellasera.
 That's what all the balloons were for on Sept. 22, not simply because it also was the first day of fall.

Bellasera Neighborhood News, October 2009, 5 years ago

- Thanks to everyone who responded to my request for feedback on the issues of the front entry paving and plants/artwork in the front yards. There were 16 responses and the results were very clear. On the issue of spending some extra money to improve the look of the entry/parking lot asphalt, 73% of you were opposed to it. Many of you understandably indicated the difficult economic times as a reason to wait until the defective material wears off. Regarding taking a look at our Design Guidelines and considering loosening them a bit, 73% of you were in favor of making some minor modifications to the plant/artwork requirements as long as the intent of the restrictions was maintained. These opinions will be helpful to the Board as it looks at policy issues so thanks again for taking the time to respond. --Chuck Roach
- The City of Scottsdale recently conducted an inspection of the roadways and washes in Bellasera. They brought to the
 attention of management that some landscaping crews are blowing cacti into the washes instead of disposing of them
 properly. There is a large amount of the debris and the City's concern is that the cacti will clog the drains after a rain
 which will cause a significant amount of problems.
- The Bellasera community extends its sympathy and condolences to the family and many friends of Walt Winston, 81, who passed away on September 16, following a three year struggle with cancer. Walt volunteered his time and talent in our community as a member of the Modifications Committee for several years. He was an accomplished artist, with one of his oil paintings now on permanent display at the new Scottsdale Healthcare Thompson Peak Hospital. He's survived by his wife, Joyce; one son; one daughter; and one granddaughter.

October in the Garden

The Heat Is Switched Off

Usually considered the "Month of Change", October got a head start this year as we received an unusual, but welcome, amount of rain in September. In Bellasera, our September total was 4.5 inches including over an inch in the last weekend of the month as well as a precipitous drop in temperature. Reminder: Go to azbellasera.org, click or touch "Local Links" and you will find a link for our weather.

Prime Planting Month

October is the prime planting month for low-desert gardens as root systems have seven months of mild temperatures to establish before triple-digit heat returns. And, our recent rainfall will further enhance these conditions.

What to Plant

Just about everything can be planted now but, if you want to enhance your landscape, some things to consider that are especially suited for this time of year are:

Desert-Adapted Trees -Shrubs (see below) -Vines -Ground Covers -Cacti (and other succulents).

Match the plant's sun exposure needs to what your landscape offers. Also, determine each plant's mature height and width and compare to the space in your landscape where it will grow. Getting the right size plant will save you time and money in the years ahead because it eliminates otherwise unnecessary pruning just to keep a plant from encroaching where it doesn't belong.

Shrubs-Some Recommendations

Here in the Sonoran Desert, we do not get the brilliant fall colors like other areas. However, I would recommend that you consider several shrubs (below) that rise to the occasion.

Heavenly Bamboo - An Asian plant which turns bright red to red- orange in the fall

Firebush - As the weather cools, leaves begin to turn a dark coppery red. They remain this color through the winter.

Beach Vitex - Before this deciduous shrub loses its leaves they turn a dusky purple-red.

Crape Myrtle - Coloring is variable, but most plants turn a reddish hue before they lose their leaves.

Mexican Jumping Bean - This hot weather loving shrub leaves turn a fiery red in late winter.

Copper-leaved Caesalpinia - The small leaves turn from a deep burnished red to a bright golden red through the winter.

Consider Sage (Salvia)

Sage, which has close to 900 species, is the largest genus in the mint family and, more often than not, the ornamental varieties are known by their botanical name, **Salvia**. This easy-to-grow landscape favorite produces flower stalks on bushy plants. Its blossoms range in color from red to pink and purple to blue. Invigorating "desert" scents and pretty flowers for pollinators are reasons to grow autumn sage.

A profuse bloomer, **Sage** attracts hummingbirds, bees and butterflies, from late winter to early fall. Its blooms make excellent cut flowers, and its fragrant foliage has been known to repel pests. Some suggestions: *Chaparral Sage - Desert Sage - Red Sage - White Sage* (which has lovely silvery-white foliage).

For your herb garden, consider adding one or more of the following culinary types: Green Sage - Golden Variegated Sage - Tricolor Sage

Most sage plants benefit from afternoon shade or filtered light during low-desert summers.

Add Color to Your Patio

As was mentioned last month, this is a perfect time to add color to your surroundings with some flower beds (preferably in pots) as the nurseries will be packed with glorious selections in every size, color, and shape. Some additional flower recommendations are: Lobelia, Geraniums, Alyssum, Marigold, Dusty miller, Pansy, Blue salvia, Sweet Pea, Petunia, Dianthus, Snapdragon, Johnny Jump Up. Again, if you have summer annual flower beds, it's time to pull them out and rejuvenate.

Miscellaneous Tasks

Roses-Resume full fertilizing of established roses as the weather cools.

Landscape Plants-Cut off spent blooms to stimulate re-bloom.

Mesquite Trees-If your Mesquite trees are looking tall and scraggly, take action now to do some corrective pruning.

Prune-Cut back spring-flowering perennials like *brittlebush*, *globe mallow*, *ruellia*, and groundcovers like *sundrops*, and *trailing bush* hard this month. If the plant is especially leggy or unruly, prune to remove at least 1/3 of the plant or more. After pruning, water well.
