New Committee On Bellasera Roads

At the November meeting of the Board, the Directors voted to create a new Ad-Hoc Committee on Roads to develop and make recommendations to the Board of Directors with regard to a plan of action for ongoing road repair and maintenance of Bellasera's Roads. Road repair and maintenance is the most significant item in our Reserve Budget, comprising more than 80% of our future projected capital expenditures. The new Committee is composed of two members of the Building & Grounds Committee and three members from our Budget & Finance Committee along with the Board Member representative for each such committee. The new Roads Committee will meet with our road consultant, Michael Frank Civil Engineering, who prepared a recent study of Bellasera's roads, as required to develop their recommended course of action. Committee meetings are open to all Bellasera resident members and will be held at the clubhouse. Meeting times will be posted in the Bellasera Newsletter and at each mail box. The first meeting of the Road Committee will be held at 1:00 p.m. on Monday, December 15 in the clubhouse.

Update On 12-Acre Parcel

I recently met with the Owners of the 12-Acre Parcel adjacent to our community to whom we have granted access through Bellasera in settlement of the recent lawsuit. They have now decided not to develop the property themselves but to instead offer the property for sale. The property will be marketed shortly. December in the Garden

Our recent chilly weather gave us a taste of winter only to be tempered by a record high temperature on Thanksgiving Day. However, rest assured, we do have a winter here in the Sonoran Desert that brings with it cold weather and rain (hopefully). So, it's time to review winter guidelines for your garden as well as identify some opportunities for pruning and planting (I'll include some holiday suggestions).

Winter Guidelines

Frost

Freezing temperatures are probably not imminent but they are guaranteed to occur sometime in the next few months. When it happens, follow these guidelines:

- 1. At sunset, drape frost cloth, burlap or old sheets and blankets (never plastic) over cold-tender plants, such as bougainvillea, citrus, hibiscus, natal plum, roses and annual flowers and vegetables.
- 2. Extend the canopy over the entire plant or area, allowing it to hang to the ground. If possible, support the cloth on temporary framework so that it does not touch foliage. The goal is to trap heat radiating from the ground beneath the cover, warming the air around the plant.
- 3. Remove the cover the next morning before temperatures reach 50 degrees F, or it will heat up like a greenhouse beneath the cloth.

Watering

I briefly covered this last month but feel it's important to reiterate and expand on guidelines for the winter. With normal winter rainfall and temperatures, reduce watering frequency and reset automatic timers along the following guidelines: *Native/desert adapted*—Trees (30 to 60 days); Shrubs (30 to 45 days); Ground covers and vines (21 to 45 days); *Non-native*—Trees (14 to 40 days); Shrubs, ground cover and vines (10 to 14 days).

Please note that the watering frequencies and ranges are affected by rainfall amounts.

Roses, Fruit Trees and Holiday Plants

Roses

This is the time of the year to plant *bare-root roses*. Because you have a month or more to plant them, take some time to look for the best quality plants in the varieties that grow best in the valley. So, here are some guidelines:

Purchasing

- -- Bargain prices often mean inferior plants.
- -- A healthy plant should have large, healthy canes with no leaves but visible buds, and strong anchor roots with at least some secondary and feeder roots
- -- Never buy roses that have been dipped in wax.
- -- Keep them cool, moist (or soaking in water) and in the shade until you are ready to plant.

Planting

- -- Plant within a week after purchase.
- -- They should do well in a 2-foot by 2-foot hole that is well amended with organic matter.

Fruit Trees

It is an ideal time to plant **Bare-Root Deciduous Fruit Trees**. Select varieties that require less than 400 chilling hours. Your local nursery can help you find those. Chilling hours are defined as those in which temperatures are below 45 degrees. Each variety of fruit tree requires a certain amount to flower and set fruit. Maricopa County averages 300 to 400 chilling hours annually.

Holiday Plants

Browse nurseries for living decor that can be added to the garden after the holiday season. Topiary-shaped rosemary plants make fragrant center-pieces. Maintain their shapes by frequent snipping, and use trimmings in the kitchen (all rosemary species are edible). Rosemary prefers a sunny location and soil that's on the dry side.

Red poinsettia is a traditional choice, although growers are producing varieties in cream, pink and peach, as well as plants with unusual "double flowers" that resemble roses.

Flowers

If you haven't done so already, I encourage you to brighten up your patio or backyard with some colorful winter flowers such as pansies or petunias. It's not too late as they are easily planted from nursery 6-packs or 6 inch pots.

Miscellaneous

Holiday Tip— Christmas tree trunks need a fresh cut to promoter water uptake before being put in the Christmas tree stand.

<u>Citrus</u>—Continue to harvest citrus, testing for sweetness. If small fruit size is noticed it may be due to heavy fruit set or the weather. Lack of normal rainfall during the mid-summer period can influence fruit size. Citrus fruit growth is greater as a response to rain versus a similar amount of irrigation.

Succulents—Do not prune them this month.

Fertilization—Do not fertilize this month.

In the vegetable garden—Plant artichokes, beets, broccoli, cabbage, carrots, cauliflower, lettuce, peas, radishes.

<u>Pruning</u>—December is a good time to prune Texas sage, roses and other desert and deciduous shrubs as well as to start thinning, pruning, and reshaping many of our desert trees such as mesquite, palo verde, acacia, and other deciduous trees.

Garden Maintenance

Feed vegetable gardens—Cool-season veggies benefit from a side-dressing of nitrogen fertilizer, especially if soil is not rich in nutrients. Organic nitrogen fertilizers include alfalfa meal, blood meal, cottonseed meal and fish emulsion. If plants show signs of nitrogen deficiency, such as yellowing of older, lower leaves, use a chemical fertilizer, which is faster-acting than organic fertilizer.
