Bellasera in the Rear View Mirror

A look back in Bellasera history that may bring back memories for long-time residents and be of interest to those not living in our community in prior years. Clips from past newsletters follow.

Bellasera Neighborhood News, June 2005, 10 years ago

- A representative group of Bellasera residents attended a presentation and working session with Gary and Jim Pederson on May 16, to better understand the plans for the corner of Lone Mountain & Scottsdale Rd. During the session the Bellasera group provided community specific "wants and needs" as gathered via meetings and survey over the last 6 months. Three priority issues were identified by the group as unacceptable to Bellasera in the Pederson plan: 1. The current L shape design does not meet the spirit of the PCC Zoning guidelines. 2. The current development orientation is not acceptable. At a minimum, the opportunity exists to relocate the "largest box" to the northwest corner of the property maximizing the distance between the development and Bellasera home sites, thus minimizing noise and traffic to homeowners. 3. Current Pederson plans which include a maximum height of 44 feet for Bashas' (Peak) building are not acceptable. The community does not support placement of AC units and other appurtenances on top of buildings and increasing development height to "screen" these appurtenances.

June in the Garden

Summer is in Sight...I Promise!

In last month's column, I observed that the cool temperatures and rain in April was wonderful but we shouldn't be fooled into thinking the hot weather wasn't on its way. I reminded you that May almost always gives us a peek into summer with some hot, dry weather. Our winter visitors (aka Snow Birds) certainly followed the anticipated warmup as most of them fled for their cooler residences. Well, the warmup didn't happen...we experienced another delightful month.

So, here we go again...June is predictably hot and dry with lots of days over 100°F and a few as high as 110°F or more—and often not a drop of moisture. These conditions provide a variety of garden challenges and tasks for you, mostly related to the heat. And, as always, you still have some planting opportunities.

Summer Tasks

<u>Mulch</u>- Add a 3-inch layer of organic mulch (compost, dried leaves, grass clippings, wood chips) to the soil around plants to prevent weeds, maintain moisture, and slightly lower soil temperature. As the mulch decomposes, it adds nutrients to the soil.

Roses

- Cut back on fertilizing established roses to encourage plants to slow down for the hot summer.
- Water deeply as temperatures climb.
- Hose off plants in the early morning to increase humidity and control spider mites.

Protect Citrus Trunks

Tree bark on southern and western exposures is highly susceptible to sunburn from April through September. After burning, bark blackens, cracks and peels, allowing easy entry for pests and diseases. The best method to prevent sunburn is to:

- Leave low branches growing on the tree, as their foliage shades the trunk or
- Paint the bark with white latex paint specifically formulated for this purpose or
- Loosely wrap exposed bark with burlap, cardboard, cloth or newspaper (Remove the wrap at the end of summer).

<u>Chlorosis</u>- This is caused by an Iron deficiency which is typified by yellow leaves with contrasting green veins. Apply a chelated iron product to the soil around the root zone, following the package instructions.

<u>Fertilization</u>- It is best not to fertilize this month as the tender new growth may burn quickly in the heat of early summer. If you choose to fertilize, do so only once at half strength. Fertilizers, especially inorganic ones, are high in salts that can accumulate quickly in the dry, hot conditions of summer.

Watering Guidelines

It is imperative that we, once again review *watering guidelines* to effectively maintain your garden through the hot summer. Ineffective water management is the number one cause of death of landscape plants in the Valley, and, believe it or not, it is more frequently from over watering than under watering. You can reduce your water bill and take better care of your plants it you water **slowly** (prevents run off), **deeply** and **infrequently** (let the soil dry between watering).

<u>How Much</u> - Ensure that you are deep watering your landscape plants to prevent salt build-up. Use a soil probe or a long-handled screw-driver to determine how deeply water is penetrating.

A simple guideline is the 1-2-3 Rule:

- 1 foot deep for small, shallow rooted plants.
- 2 feet deep for shrubs.
- 3 feet deep for trees.

<u>How Often</u> – An often asked question and, in addition to the irrigation guidelines below, it is important to take into consideration weather, soil conditions, plant maturity and how well the plant has adapted to the desert. **Remember-** let soil dry between waterings.

7-21 days - Desert-adapted trees

7-14 days - Non-Desert adapted trees

7-21 days - Desert shrubs

5-7 days - Non–Desert adapted shrubs

What to Plant?

June is the low desert's most difficult month for gardens and landscapes. Temperatures shoot into triple digits, while the respite provided to plants by monsoon rains and humidity is a month or two away. It is best to wait until fall to add plants to your landscape. However, you can consider the following:

Sunflowers

Sow seeds in a sunny spot where you can enjoy seeing the blooms' cheerful-looking faces during summer. In fall, sunflower seeds attract goldfinches. Some choices: Chocolate Cherry, Autumn Beauty, Evening Sun, Snack Seed, Mammoth Russian, Lemon Queen.

In limited space or containers, try: Dwarf Junior, Dwarf Teddy Bear

Herbs

This is a good month to plant herbs as they are widely available in small pots right now and inexpensive (\$3-\$4). You'll find them in grocery stores well as nurseries including: Oregano, Thyme, Mint Parsley, Sage, Basil

You can transplant them to larger pots where they are easily maintained. If you like, set them on the ground and hook them up to your drip system. For Rosemary, I would recommend planting in the ground, long term, as they do very well here in Bellasera.

Caution - Do not over-water herbs, especially those native to the Mediterranean area, such as lavender, oregano and rosemary. They are well adapted to dry soil, and their roots will rot if kept overly moist. Water should soak through the entire root zone to a depth of 1 foot with each irrigation. Let the top few inches of soil dry out before applying more water.

Warm-Season Vegetables and Herbs

Sow seeds for Armenian Cucumbers, Basil, Black-eyed Peas, Cantaloupe and Okra
