

Visitors & Vendors in Bellasera

All residents are reminded to please either <u>use QuickPass</u> (info below) or <u>call</u> the gate guard (**480-488-3663**) when visitors/vendors are expected. QuickPass is a web site for all Bellasera homeowners designed to make your life easier, and help Securitas, USA personnel at the guard house manage visitors and vendors. If you have not set up your account yet, you're strongly encouraged to do so. The men at the front gate *thank you* for doing so.

Here's how to set up a Quick Pass Account:

- ⇒ Log on to Quick Pass: www.quickpass.us
- ⇒ On the next screen click on Log In (it will be on the upper right side of the screen)
- ⇒ On the next screen click on Request an Account
- ⇒ Fill in the required information and click **Submit**. Exit Quick Pass
- ⇒ You will receive a separate e-mail advising you of your User Name and Password
- ⇒ Once you have the User Name and Password, log back on to Quick Pass: www.quickpass.us
- ⇒ Click on Log In (it will be on the upper right side of the screen)
- ⇒ Input your new User Name and Password, click on Go
- ⇒ Once you have an account you will be able to change your password, add/delete visitors and obtain a Key Pad Number for after hours entry.

Note: QuickPass applications for mobile devices (cell phones, tablets) are also available. Search for "QuickPass visitor management."

Authorized visitors will need a Key Pad Number to enter the Scottsdale Road gate <u>between 1:00</u> and 5:00 a.m. every day.

To obtain a Key Pad Number:

- \Rightarrow In the Main Menu (after you obtain your password)
- ⇒ Go to Manage Account
- ⇒ Under Permanent Visitors click on Quick Add
- ⇒ Input Name of Visitor
- ⇒ Under Add/Modify Visitor click the drop down arrow and click Family & Friends
- ⇒ Click Assign Code
- ⇒ Click Visitor type and choose Family & Friends
- ⇒ Input a code of at least five (5) numbers
- ⇒ Click SAVE

When using QuickPass software to alert the gate guard of expected visitors/vendors on a particular day, please <u>make the start time 7:00 a.m.</u> If a later time is indicated, the request is not visible to the guard until the time you specify. If the visitor/vendor is early, it's unknown to the guard.

Bulk Trash Collection

The City of Scottsdale provides brush & bulk trash collection in our community every four weeks. In March it's during the week of **March 7**, next month, the week of **April 4**.

Here's additional information from the city regarding bulk trash collection.

Appliance and Move-In Box Collection

A special pickup to haul away move-in boxes for residential collection customers who just moved into a single -family residential home in Scottsdale. The city will also pick up appliances that you would like to dispose of.

Move-In Box Collection For New Residents

Schedule your one-time collection of move-in boxes online or over the phone, 480-312-5600.

Please completely empty your boxes and flatten them before placing them for collection.

Because the boxes are taken to a recycling facility, any boxes that are not completely empty will not be picked up by our crews.

Packing paper can be placed in bags and set out for pick up during the monthly scheduled brush and bulk item collection.

Appliance Collection

Schedule an appliance pickup online or over the phone, 480-312-5600.

Once per month the city will haul away major appliances such as washers & dryers, stoves/ovens, water heaters, dishwashers, refrigerators and freezers.

Appliances containing Freon, such as refrigerators and freezers, will not be collected unless the compressor has been removed and the Freon recovered by a certified technician in accordance with Federal Law.

The city's information line connects you with live operators who have much of the event, traffic and meeting information that you want, or will forward your call to the correct department for further assistance. The line is open from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday and for special events as publicized. Bellasera in the Rear View Mirror

A look back in Bellasera history that may bring back memories for long-time residents and be of interest to those not living in our community 5 & 10 years ago. Clips from past newsletters follow.

Bellasera Neighborhood News, March 2006, 10 years ago

- Bellasera's Annual Meeting is rapidly approaching on April 6 at 6:30 PM at Terravita. One of the most important topics at the Annual Meeting is to elect Directors for the 2006 Board. There are three openings on the Board (Paul Broad and Mike Simpson have chosen not to run and Crawford Love resigned earlier because he was moving out of the community). It took two postings to solicit candidates for the Board openings. So far, Shawn Meyer, Charles Roach, Bob Shriver have submitted applications to be elected as Directors.
- Congratulations to Bellasera Security Guard Mike Meindl who's being recognized for five years of service to
 the Bellasera community. Mike, who usually works the evening shift, has a ways to go to catch up to popular
 Bellasera Officer-In-Charge, Keven Peterson. Keven, working the weekday daytime shift, has been serving
 the Bellasera community for nearly 7 years. Both men are employed by Securitas Security Services USA, Inc.,
 which provides security service to Bellasera via a competitive contract that is awarded annually.
- We have received approximately 60 surveys on rating our management company, which is a return rate of about 16%. We typically have a 30% return rate with our surveys. A low return rate usually indicates relative satisfaction with the state of affairs. The Communications Committee is analyzing the surveys, and the results will be available in the April newsletter.
- Another topic of conversation at the 3/13 Board meeting will be the number of complaints we have received about dogs being off leash on the grassy area, which is a violation of Scottsdale and Maricopa ordinances. If you have a "pro" or "con" interest in this topic, I encourage you to come to the Board meeting to hear first hand what action the Board is proposing on this topic.--Carol Sotnick

- Keypad entry at the Scottsdale Road gate will begin on Tuesday, March 1, from 1:00 to 5:00 a.m. each day. No guard will be on duty during these hours. See the letter that was sent to all homeowners in early February, or call the Community Manager's Office for clarification or additional information.
- You have probably noticed that we have recently redecorated our clubhouse. With the help of an interior decorator, we chose a color palette and came up with what we thought would be a practical, up-to-date look for our outdated clubhouse. Board members and management staff then set out seeking contractors, furniture, window coverings and carpet and worked to obtain the best deals on all components of the job. March in the Garden

Winter Has Let Go! (Quickly)

Catch Up With Your Garden

Our cool weather early last month is now a distant memory as it appears we have leap-frogged into spring. We've been the recipient of some beautiful weather and it has had a visible effect on our environment. With ample winter rainfall, followed by the above average temperatures, you'll find that your garden is ahead of schedule and deserves some attention. So, take a walk around your property and you'll notice the following:

<u>Minimal Frost Damage</u>- Our landscape plants have experienced very little frost damage as evidenced by the flowering perennials such as bougainvillea, penstemon and honeysuckle which continue to sparkle.

New Growth- Your garden has come alive. Take a look at any of your landscape plants and you'll see plenty of new growth especially those with a southern exposure. Also, your citrus should be loaded with buds right now.

Mesquite Trees- We have a variety of mesquite here in Bellasera and they are quickly losing their leaves at various rates depending on species and exposure. You will find new leaf growth already on some, especially velvet mesquite.

Pruning, Planting and Maintenance

March is traditionally an excellent month for planting and this year has presented us with ideal conditions. However, I think you should consider pruning and general upkeep before planting.

Pruning

In general, pruning should be done to maintain plant health (remove dead, damaged or diseased portions, cross branching, etc.), to highlight the "natural" shape of the plant, to train a young plant, and to eliminate hazards. Excessive or heavy pruning causes significant stress to trees and shrubs. The best practices are to prune the least amount necessary and prune for legitimate reasons. How much to prune depends on the size, species, age, as well as your intentions. A few good principles to remember--a tree or shrub can recover from several small pruning wounds faster than from a single large wound and never remove more than 25% of the canopy in a year.

Some specific plants that should be considered for pruning:

Summer and fall flowering shrubs including:

- Texas Sages Yellow Bells Lantana Turpentine Bush
- Mexican-honeysuckle
 Sky Flower
 Black Dalea

Warm-season herbaceous perennials, groundcovers and vines including:

- Chocolate Flower Plumbago Mexican Hat Gaura Mealy-cup Sage
- Rock Verbena Trailing Lantana Dyssodia Queen's Wreath
- Passion Vines Yellow Orchid-vine

Miscellaneous

- Continue to deadhead annuals and herbaceous perennials to encourage continued flowering including Desert Marigold, Red Sage, Angelita-Daisy and Gaillardia.
- •Wait to prune your prickly-pears and chollas until after flowering. Spent stalks of aloes, agaves and other succulents can be removed at this time.
- •Prune by cutting back to emerging growth or to the basal rosette (group of leaves arranged from a central point).

Watering

Up until recently, cool temperatures and adequate rainfall have obviated the need for any watering. However, with our rising temperatures and little recent rainfall, it's time perform some annual maintenance on your drip system. Specifically:

- Test the timer to see if it is working properly.
- Check for leaks and clogged emitters and flush out the poly lines.
- · Replace back-up batteries if necessary.

How often to water?

Background-Although desert plants have developed mechanisms for conserving and storing water, none have given up the need for water entirely. There are many variables that determine how much and how often plants need supplemental water such as:

- •Soil: Soils with high clay content hold moisture well, too well for some desert plants, and could be amended with a small amount of organic matter and coarse sand. Rocky soils hold little moisture so plants growing in them require more frequent watering.
- •Temperature: Most desert plants grow when it is warm. Active growth coupled with high evaporation rates means that more water is needed in warmer months.
- •Age and size: All plants, even desert plants, need more water when they are young and when they have been recently transplanted

General Guidelines- Assumptions are mature plants and temperatures stay below 100

degrees:

- •Every 3 to 4 weeks, at least 2 hours each watering.
- •About every 5th watering, run system a few hours longer to leach out salts that have accumulated around plant.

Notes:

- •All plants, even desert plants, need more water when they are young and when they have been recently transplanted.
- Adjust schedule to rainfall received.
- •Mature trees need no watering during this time of year

Planting

Most of our gardens here in Bellasera are mature and we are usually adding plants to replace ones that have died or enhance an area in our garden. Well, March is a terrific month for adding most plant types to our low-desert landscapes as warming soil temperatures will enhance seed germination and root development before the arrival of summer's intense heat. It's the ideal time to satisfy a multitude of requirements including **landscape** (Trees, shrubs, groundcovers, vines, perennials, cacti and other succulents etc.) **vegetables, herbs and flowers.**

Take a tour of your garden, identify requirements and make a trip to a local nursery as they will be well stocked to satisfy your needs.

If you're into vegetables, try transplants of: •Artichokes •Eggplant • Peppers •Tomatoes.

If you'd like to try a herb garden, try the usual favorites of: •Basil • Chives •Marjoram •Mint

Oregano •Parsley •Sage

Miscellaneous

<u>Fertilization</u>- Now is the time to fertilize your warm-season cacti, succulents, herbaceous and woody perennials, and annuals in containers. Periodic fertilization may be needed for plants in containers as nutrients will have diminished in the soil over time. Depending on the type of fertilizer used, follow directions on the label.

Continue to fertilize your vegetable and herb garden as needed. March is also a good time to apply a layer of composted mulch to your vegetable and herb beds.

<u>Roses</u>- Continue feeding roses every six weeks to prepare them for spring's peak bloom. Spread fresh mulch to maintain consistent soil moisture, making sure mulch does not touch their stems.

<u>Citrus-</u> Do not prune citrus except to remove dead or damaged wood and branches obstructing pathways, views, or structures.

Rosemary- They are in a growth spurt and starting to bloom. Do not prune until they are finished blooming.

Note: Plant of the month will resume next month.
