Dog Park Reminder

I know it's an old reminder, but <u>Please</u>, <u>Please</u> pick up after your dog both in the dog park and throughout the Bellasera community. We even provide the pickup bags for your use! Also, if your dog is ill, please avoid bringing him/her to the dog park.

Parvovirus Cases On the Rise

Veterinarians in Arizona say they're seeing more parvovirus cases. Parvo is transmitted through feces, so dogs can pick it up at parks or while out on a walk. Symptoms include decreased appetite, lethargy, vomiting and diarrhea.

Parvo is extremely contagious and deadly about 50 percent of the time. In colder climates, freezing winter weather kills the virus. But here in Arizona, it can live on surfaces for a year.

Please be aware of these symptoms and if your dog shows any of them, PLEASE do not bring him/her to the dog park until you confirm that they are healthy and not contagious.

The only way to stop the spread is to make sure your dog is up to date on all its shots, picking up after your dog and wiping down contaminated surfaces with bleach.

Let's work hard not to spread disease in our community.

Board Business

Road Work Complete. The major 2017 Road Work Project for Bellasera is now substantially complete and, with the new holiday lighting at our entrances, what a positive difference it makes to the overall appearance of our community!

Some additional clean-up/touch-up work will be done over the next week or so, but considering the scope and size of the project, the work proceeded with very few hiccups, on time and under budget. We are pleased with the results. The Board wishes to express its thanks to our residents for the necessary inconveniences they suffered while this work proceeded. The Board recognizes the truly exceptional job done by Communications Committee member **Keith Christian** and **Laurie**, our Community Manager, to alert our residents to the scheduling and street closures while the work progressed. Thanks to all for your patience.

Board Defers Action on New Pickleball Request. At its November meeting, the Board received and considered a new recommendation from the Building & Grounds Committee to approve the purchase of several movable nets and a restriping to allow pickleball to be played on one of our existing tennis courts.

This issue previously came up at the Board's regular May meeting. At that time the Board unanimously rejected a similar proposal after being presented with numerous objections from neighboring homeowners to the harsh tinny sound typically generated from such activity when the plastic pickle ball comes in contact with the paddles used in the game. The new pickleball proposal included requiring the use of newly developed composite paddles, which are designed to reduce the noise to a less objectionable level.

The Board gives great weight to the recommendations it receives from its various committees and the apparent strong interest in this activity expressed by many of our residents. The Board also recognizes the physical exercise and social benefits the game provides. Nevertheless, in view of the strong views and objections we continue to receive from many adjacent homeowners, and the issue of policing the use of less noisy paddles. The Board decided to take no action – for or against – on this proposal at this time. We will explore the cost and efficiency of adding new sound deadening acoustic panels/screens to the perimeter fences at the tennis courts to block or reduce any objectionable noise from our immediate neighbors. The Board will take up this issue again when we have further facts and costs to consider.

December in the Garden

Yes, Winter Is Nearby!

We had record heat on Thanksgiving Day which was a reminder that November brought us no rain (except for a few sprinkles) and higher than normal temperatures. It extended our "drought" another month and didn't provide us much of an introduction into our beautiful winter. Don't give up hope as we do have a winter here in the Sonoran Desert that will bring cooler weather and rain (hopefully) which will be welcomed by you and your garden. So, in spite of our warm weather, it is time to review *winter guidelines* for your garden as well as identifying some opportunities for *pruning* and *planting*. I'll also be providing some annual *Holiday Tips*.

Winter Guidelines

<u>Watering</u>- I briefly covered this last month but feel it's important to reiterate and expand on guidelines for the winter. With normal winter rainfall and temperatures, reduce watering frequency and reset automatic timers along the following guidelines:

Native/desert adapted- Trees (30 to 60 days)

- Shrubs (30 to 45 days)
- Ground covers and vines (21 to 45 days)

Non-native- Trees (14 to 40 days)

- Shrubs, ground cover and vines (10 to 14 days)

Please note the watering frequencies and ranges are affected by rainfall amounts. Miraculously, plants seem to know the difference between irrigation and rain. Even with steady, appropriate irrigation, fruit set and growth is always better with adequate rain.

* Native trees are mostly drought tolerant and, once established, need no supplemental watering as our normal rainfall is sufficient. They may need a soaking once or twice during our hot season if rainfall is below normal. This applies to most of the trees here in Bellasera.

Note: If you have the time and patience, I recommend turning off your drip system timers after a rainfall and manually triggering a watering cycle as necessary.

Container Plants that are winter dormant should be watered once a month or less. Winter growers in containers can be watered once a week depending on the weather conditions.

<u>Frost-Illestores</u> I covered frost last month but here are some additional suggestions.

If freezing temperatures are predicted, follow these guidelines:

- **1.** At sunset, drape frost cloth, burlap or old sheets and blankets (never plastic) over cold-tender plants, such as bougainvillea, citrus, hibiscus, natal plum, roses, annual flowers and vegetables.
- **2.** Extend the canopy over the entire plant or area, allowing it to hang to the ground. If possible, support the cloth on temporary framework so that it does not touch foliage. The goal is to trap heat radiating from the ground beneath the cover, warming the air around the plant.
- **3.** Remove the cover the next morning before temperatures reach 50 degrees F, or it will heat up like a greenhouse beneath the cloth.

Did You Know? The following are particularly frost sensitive: •Red Fairy Duster •Yellow Bells and Lantana

Planting: Herbs, Vegetables, Roses and Trees

(Here in the Sonoran Desert, we can always find something to plant.)

Herbs- You can transplant or sow a variety of herbs such as:

<u>Transplant</u> • borage • salad burnet • calendula • feverfew • French sorrel • lobelia • chamomile (German & Roman) • pennyroyal • Johnny jump-ups

<u>Sow Seeds</u> • cilantro • borage • caraway • chervil • chicory • dill • fennel • Florence fennel • holly-hocks • parsley

Vegetables-The following vegetables can be **sown** or **transplanted**.

Transplant • asparagus • head and leaf lettuces • cabbage • cauliflower • kohlrabi

<u>Sow Seeds</u> • beets • bok choy • carrots • collards • mustard greens • green onions • peas • radishes • spin-ach • turnips

Bare-Root Roses- This is the perfect time of the year to plant barefoot roses. Because you have a month or more to

plant them, take some time to look for the best quality plants in the varieties that grow best in the valley. Here are some guidelines:

Purchasing

- Bargain prices often mean inferior plants.
- A healthy plant should have large, healthy canes with no leaves but visible buds and strong anchor roots with at least some secondary and feeder roots.
- Never buy roses that have been dipped in wax.
- Keep them cool, moist (or soaking in water) and in the shade until you are ready to plant.

Planting

- Plant within a week after purchase.
- They should do well in a 2-foot by 2-foot hole that is well amended with organic matter.

<u>Trees-</u> If your garden has a need, this a good time to plant or transplant deciduous trees. Deciduous trees planted on the south side of a house provide summer shade but allow sunlight through during winter when the leaves are off.

Pruning

I covered this last month but here are some additional guidelines for December:

- •Continue pruning deciduous trees such as Desert-willow, Cat-claw Acacia, and Chaste Tree.
- •Resist the urge to prune any damage on plants due to frost and do not prune cold-tender plants, wait until springtime.
- •Many agaves are semi-dormant at this time and old, dead leaves can be removed by gently pulling from the base. Resist the urge to pull out the dead leaves that are firmly attached as this can damage the base of the agave.
- •Avoid pruning Mesquites or Palo Verdes.

December is also a good time to prune **Texas sage**, **roses** and other **desert and deciduous shrubs**. Do **not** prune frost sensitive plants such as **bougainvillea** and **hibiscus**.

Miscellaneous

<u>Citrus</u>- Continue to harvest citrus, testing for sweetness. If small fruit size is noticed it may be due to heavy fruit set or the weather. Lack of normal rainfall during the mid-summer period can influence fruit size. Citrus fruit growth is greater as a response to rain versus a similar amount of irrigation.

Succulents - Do not prune them this month.

Fertilization - Do not fertilize this month.

Annual Holiday Tips

<u>Christmas Trees</u>-I'm not sure anyone in Bellasera purchases a live Christmas tree. So, I will dispense with advice. If you plan to purchase a live tree and would like some tips on purchasing and maintaining refer back to my December 2016 column which can be found at **azbellasera.org**.

<u>Holiday Lights On Plants</u>- If you must put holiday lights on your plants and trees, take care to wrap them loosely and remember to remove them after the holiday season. Don't put "costumes" on saguaros or other columnar cacti, as this inhibits the plants ability to photosynthesize. However, lights on frost sensitive cacti and succulents can add a few degrees of protection during the cold winter months.

<u>Poinsettias</u>- I have noticed there was a wide selection of healthy, good looking poinsettias available locally. If you purchase one, follow these simple handling instructions to keep them looking good during the holiday season: After purchase, remove decorative foil wraps from pots so that water doesn't accumulate and cause root rot. Alternatively, remove the foil when you water, let the plant drain in the sink, and then rewrap. Place pots in a bright spot but away from cold drafts, heating vents and fireplaces. Feed with a slow-release fertilizer or with an all-purpose fertilizer for blooming plants at half-strength every two weeks.

Enjoy Your Surroundings

At this time of year, I would encourage you to get out and enjoy Bellasera. Our community is beautiful this time of year, attributed mostly to our magnificent gardens whose flowering shrubs (Bougainvillea, Lantana, Bird of Paradise, Honey-suckle and others) are in full bloom and will continue for the next couple of months. And, when our winter rains arrive, many shrubs such as brittlebush, creosote, and ocotillos will sprout bright new leaves adding to the color and vibrancy our surroundings.
