

# Scottsdale Brush & Bulk Trash Pickup

Once each month (usually the last week of the month or the first week of the next month), the City of Scottsdale will pick up bulk trash and yard waste placed curbside in front of each home. Items accepted are discarded furniture, TVs (not tube), mattresses, tree limbs and branches, grass clipping and other plant material. Not accepted items include dirt, rocks, sand, concrete or other construction or remodel debris, chemicals and typical household generated trash. We publish the dates for the next scheduled Brush & Bulk Trash pickups in our Bellasera Newsletter.

Recently you may have noticed that Brush & Bulk Trash left out in front of homes in Bellasera last month remained curbside for several weeks on end. We have spoken to the City and they have indicated that recent delays are the result of staffing issues and the increased volumes of brush & bulk trash being discarded during the Covid-19 pandemic. This all causes the normal pickup 'windows' to be extended. They expect to return to a normal, more predictable schedule gradually.

## **New Regular Trash and Recycling Pickup Days**

Beginning this November, the City of Scottsdale will be changing the weekly days for regular trash and recycling pickups.

Starting *Wednesday, November 3* and each Wednesday thereafter, Recyclables will be picked up curbside.

Beginning *Friday, November 5* and each Friday thereafter, regular trash will be picked up.

We will be sending out e-blast reminders as we get closer to those changes.

# **Bellasera Rules Reminders**

**Trash and recycling containers:** Trash and recycling containers may not be stored in the front area of any home and shall be placed in the pick up area no earlier than **5:00 p.m.** the day prior to pick up and removed no later than **11:59 p.m** the day of pick up. Bulk trash shall be placed in the trash pickup area no earlier than three days prior to the designated beginning day of the week specified for bulk pickup by the City of Scottsdale.

**Vehicle Parking:** All vehicles must be parked in garages or driveways and not on the street, except temporarily. Disabled or unlicensed vehicles must be parked in an enclosed garage.

Contractors: Contractors will be allowed to work from 7:00 a.m. – 5:00 p.m. Monday through Friday; Saturdays 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.. No contractors will be allowed to work on Sundays or major holidays except for an emergency.

**Overnight Parking of Vehicles:** Overnight parking of vehicles in the clubhouse parking lot will be allowed for no more than 72 hours and only with prior written permission from the community manager or the front gate attendant.

# Lone Mountain & Scottsdale Road Traffic Control

Bellasera residents have been concerned about the lack of a protected left turn signal from westbound Lone Mountain Road (LMR) to southbound Scottsdale Road (SR). According to **David Smith**, Scottsdale Senior Traffic Engineer, the City is aware of the issue and explained the rationale for possible changes and the status.

The City has made multiple recent adjustments to the signal timing at the intersection of SR/LMR in response to citizen feedback. Scottsdale Road is one of only a handful of north-south arterial roadway connections for North Scottsdale residents. Changing signal timing at SR/LMR can impact both upstream and downstream operations as well as "progression" along SR. Progression is the ability to travel the corridor (SR) while minimizing delay and stops.

When evaluating the request for installing protected turn arrows, variables such as collision history at the intersection, volumes and turning movement counts, and observations are all used to analyze the request.

For the intersection of SR/LMR, various City staff has done multiple recent observations in the field during the different times of day. Recent field reviews were conducted in March 2019, February and May 2021. The intersection is currently being monitored remotely through a Closed Circuit TV at the Scottsdale traffic operations center.

Protected turn arrows are not thought to be the optimal solution. Traffic engineers do not install left-turn arrows if the left-turn traffic is clearing consistently in one cycle, meaning one green light for the LM traffic. The City will continue to monitor and study the intersection as traffic patterns and volumes shift.



# October in the Garden

Our Delightful Month of Change and Opportunity...... To Plant! September, had its normal warm periods, but ushered in October with rain and cooler temperatures reminding us of the seven or eight months of a moderate, comfortable weather that we have ahead of us. And, more importantly, this month, considered the prime planting month, has been enhanced by our receptive, soft ground, thanks to the Monsoon and September

rains. So, survey your garden and identify your needs whether it is to replace something that isn't doing well or a simple addition. Give your garden some new life!

#### What To Plant

With temperatures having abated to a comfortable level and soil remaining sufficiently warm to promote seed germination and root growth, it is the ideal time to plant. Any plants put in the ground this month will have ample time to be well established before the summer heat returns.

What the best choices to plant? Almost anything including:

- · trees · shrubs · perennials · groundcover · vines · ornamental grasses · cacti
- · succulents · wildflowers · cool-season veggies · herbs · flowers

#### What Some Suggestions?

**Shrubs**- They will give you an opportunity to add brilliant fall colors to your garden. Consider the following:

Heavenly Bamboo - An Asian plant which turns bright red to red- orange in the fall.

Firebush - As the weather cools, leaves begin to turn a dark coppery red. They remain this color through the winter.

Beach Vitex - Before this deciduous shrub loses its leaves they turn a dusky purple-red. Crape Myrtle - Coloring is variable, but most plants turn a reddish hue before they lose their leaves.

Mexican Jumping Bean - This hot weather loving shrub leaves turn a fiery red in late winter. Copper-leaved Caesalpinia - The small leaves turn from a deep burnished red to a bright golden red through the winter.

Texas Sage — as I mentioned in previous columns, in the early development of Bellasera, Texas Sage was always included in a Landscapers list which is certainly borne out in driving around the neighborhood. It was an excellent choice as it has a lot of redeeming values. These plants are easy to care for, compact, drought-resistant and attractive bushes A profuse bloomer, Sage attracts hummingbirds, bees and butterflies, from late winter to early fall. Its blooms make excellent cut flowers, and its fragrant foliage has been known to repel pests. Some suggestions:

Chaparral Sage • Desert Sage • Red Sage • White Sage

**Citrus Trees**- Right now there is a wide selection of citrus available in our local nurseries (and COSTCO); orange, grapefruit, tangerine, etc. Citrus are easy to plant as you simply have to remember to prepare a hole no deeper than the plant's root ball but at least twice the width of their containers. This promotes root growth out into the native soil. **Remember: Only dwarf citrus trees are allowed in Bellasera.** These will still provide you with plenty of

fruit.

**Herbs**- Growing herbs are really very easy. If you prefer not to dig, most of them can be easily grown in pots. Also, "starter pots" are available at most grocery stores at a reasonable price.

Sow seeds for:

- •borage •caraway •chamomile •chervil •chives •cilantro dill •fennel
- •lemon •balm •parsley •salad burnet sorrel horehound

Transplant:

•marjoram •mint •oregano •rosemary •thyme •sage.

**Cool-Season Vegetables**- Why do we call them cool season veggies? They respond to short days and cool nights and they are grown from September through April. In the September column, I included a detailed list of which cool season veggies to plant and when to plant them. You can find the column archived at **www.azbellasera.org**.

#### **Miscellaneous Tasks**

Roses - Resume full fertilizing of established roses as the weather cools.

**Citrus**- Late summer application of nitrogen fertilizer will help fruit sizing. This is more significant for fall ripening (navel oranges and tangerines) than spring-ripening (grapefruit and Valencia oranges).

**Deciduous Fruit Trees**- Prune the water sprouts.

Landscape Plants - Cut off spent blooms to stimulate rebloom.

**Weed Control**- Pre-emergent herbicides can be applied from October through early December for winter weed control. Follow the package directions carefully for best results. Do not use pre-emergent herbicides where you will be planting seeds this season.

**Mesquite Trees**- If your Mesquite trees are looking tall and scraggly, take action now to do some corrective pruning.

#### Brighten up Your Winter Surroundings....Bring Color to Your Patio

If you planted summer annuals, now is the time to think about replacing them with winter flowers. If you didn't plant summer flowers, think about adding color to your surroundings this winter with some flower beds (preferably in pots) as the nurseries will be packed with glorious selections in every size, color, and shape. Below, is my annual list of suggestions with color info along with guidance on **where to plant them** (sun, shade, etc.), Remember, fall flowers need to establish their roots in warm soils. So, starting them now gets a healthy root system developed before the cool fall and cooler winter slows them down.

- •Alyssum: A low growing border plant in white, pink or purple. Full sun to light partial shade.
- •Begonia: Gives masses of color in shady spots, red, pink or white in dark leafed varieties, or a mixture of colors in green leafed types.
- Calendula: Yellow or orange flowers with dark centers, makes excellent cut flowers. Needs sun.
- Chrysanthemum paludosum: Miniature daisy flowers cover this low growing annual in a cloud of white. Use for sunny borders.
- *Dianthus*: An array of reds, pinks, violets and white adorn these specially selected Sweet Williams. Sun or partial shade.
- Dusty Miller: A foliage plant with silver colored leaves. Full sun to partial shade.
- Geranium: Available in a rainbow of colors. Full sun to partial shade.
- Linaria: Covered in mini snapdragon-shaped flowers of blue, yellow or red. Full sun.
- •Lobelia: Arizona's favorite border plant for sun or partial shade. Deep purple, blue, rose, lilac and mixed colors.
- Ornamental Kale: Great foliage color in predominately purple or white. Full sun.

• Pansy and Viola: The most popular flower for fall and winter, these hardy free blooming plants are available in a wide variety of colors to suit any décor. Pick a sunny spot for best results. Violas will take light shade.





• Petunia: Reds, pinks, whites, burgundy and blues. Full sun.



- **Poppies and Primroses**: These favorites will be ready for you when the weather starts to turn cold. Iceland poppies for bright sunny spots and traditional primrose for shady areas.
- **Stoc**k: Harmony and Trisomic varieties are very fragrant and make tremendous cut flowers. Midgets make excellent border plants. Full sun.

# **NEW TRASH PICK-UP DAYS:**

Beginning **November 01, 2021**, Bellasera residents will have a new trash/recycle pick-up day.

New Trash Day: **FRIDAY**New Recyling Day: **WEDNESDAY** 

The primary reason for this day of service change is to improve efficiency and make it easier to process recyclables. Current trash and recycling routes have become unbalanced due to the growth of Scottsdale. The new collection schedule is based on the number of homes on a route and the amount/weight of solid waste and recycling collected.
